Hofmann water superintendent be sent to the Water Works Association convention in Boise Idaho with expenses paid. Motion carried and so ordered.

SPECIAL MEETING OF MAY 3, 1948

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen: Hamlin, Mortensen, Frady and Nelson; Manager Taber, Attorney Kirkpatrick and Mr. Bernard Davis.

The Council discussed the proposed budget as made up by Manager Taber.

The Council approved the appointment, by Manager Taber, of the firm of Bower, Davis and Hoffman to act as Auditors for the City for the fiscal year of 1948-49.

MEETING OF MAY 10, 1948

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

700th MEETING

The seven hundredth regular meeting of the Council was held on the tenth day of May 1948

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Hamlin, Mortensen, Frady and Nelson; Manager Taber, Attorney Kirkpatrick, Treasurer Dillery and Recorder Martin.

Mayor Sperr objected to approval of the minutes of the six hundred ninety-ninth regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-sixth day of April, 1948, stating that his objections were based on the fact that his reason for his dissenting vote on the motion that the Council recommend two hour parking on Jackson Street between 21st and Front Street and Front St., were not recorded therein. Attorney Kirkpatrick explained that in the case of a dissenting vote it was the privilege of the voter to furnish, in writing, to the Recorder, his reasons for his vote, which could then be recorded in the minutes of the meeting. Mayor Sperr stated that he objected to changing the restrictions in parking on Jackson Street because such restrictions were contrary to the wishes of the business men. Other members of the Council stated that the business men were divided on the question and that the motion merely called for the Council to recommend limited parking in order that the same could be further discussed with the business men, and, after getting their opinions on the matter, it was to be brought up again at this meeting for a decision.

MEETING OF MAY 10, 1948

Cont'd

The minutes of the adjourned meeting of the Council, held on the third day of May 1948, were read and approved as read.

There were two business men present, Mr. E. Norbeck, (Milwaukie Hardware) and Leonard Mullan, (Mullan's Garage) After considerable discussion on the question of the time limitations of parking on Jackson and Jefferson Streets between 21st Street and Front Street, it was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Frady that Jefferson Street from 21st Street to Front Street be limited to two hour parking on the north side of the street and no parking restriction on the south side. The motion was carried over dissenting votes by Nelson and Hamlin.

It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Sperr that there be no parking time restriction on Jackson Street between 21st Street and Front Street. The motion was carried over dissenting votes by Nelson and Hamlin.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Frady that Wm. Hofmann be advanced \$50.00 for expense money at the Waterworks Convention at Boise Idaho. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Frady that the three volunteer Firemen, who will be selected to attend the Fire Chief's Convention at Baker Oregon, be advanced \$40.00 each before they leave Milwaukie. Motion carried and so ordered.

Martin Jensen, 1735 33rd St. appeared before the Council and stated that although the property owners along 33rd Street between Sellwood and Wister Streets had a petition filed with the City Recorder for the improvement of 33rd Street, for this one block, that nothing by way of street improvements had been done as yet, and wanted to know the reason for the lack of action. Manager Taber pointed out to Mr. Jensen the futility of grading the street when it was to be torn up by the installation of the sewer, also that the weather had been such that no grading could have been done on the street. It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Mortensen that Manager Taber prepare specifications and estimates for the improvement of 33rd Street between Sellwood and Wister Streets. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Mayor appointed Messrs. J.C. Hinshaw and Chas Kemmerer to act on the City Budget Committee for a term of three years.

Manager Taber brought up the following projects and asked the Council's opinion on the different projects, and stated that in case the Council approved, he would like to have their consent to proceed with the preliminary plans and specifications for the projects meeting their approval.

1. A work shop and storage shed or house on Lots 6 & 7 Zanders Addn.
2. A heating plant in the City Hall
3. Securing a consulting Engineer to work out improvements in the Water system.
4. The purchase of another truck for the Water Department.

The Council authorized Manager Taber to proceed with the necessary investigations and plans.

Manager Taber laid before the Council a proposed program for street improvement and repair and stated that it was not too early to proceed with the preliminary work on same. It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Frady that Manager Taber proceed with the preliminary survey and advertise for bids for the improvement as he had outlined the same. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Mayor reminded the Council of the meeting, for the purpose of levying a road tax for the City of Milwaukie, as set by the County Court, the day and hour being May 18, 1948 at 7:30 o'clock P.M.

It was decided that the Budget Committee would meet on the same evening following the road meeting.

It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Hamlin that the members of the election boards for the special election of June 15, 1948 be paid \$5.00 each for their services. Motion carried and so ordered.
