

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MAY 1ST. 1914.

An adjourned meeting of the one-hundred-forty fifth (145) regular meeting of the Town Council was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, Recorder Mathews, Councilmen, Mitchell, Loeding, Albee and Counsell and Marshal Reed. There being no objections to the proposed assessment for the improvement of Dewitt, upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Loeding and carried Ordinance No. 107, declaring the assessment for the improvement of Dewitt Street, was taken up for the first reading the ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays none. Absent councilman King. Ordinance No. 107 passed the first reading. Upon motion of Councilman Loeding seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 107 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Absent King. Ordinance No. 107 passed the second reading. Upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 107 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Absent King. Ordinance No. 107 passed the third and final reading. Upon motion of councilman Loeding seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant on the Dewitt Street fund for the sum of \$1770.85 in favor of Henry Scott as payment in full for the improvement of Dewitt Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the bids for oiling the streets for the year of 1914, were opened and read. The Oregon Road Oiling Company's bid was for \$39.00 per mile, while the Pacific Road Oiling Company's bid was at the rate of \$36.95 per mile. The bids were referred to the Street Committee and after a secret session the Committee recommended the acceptance of the bid of the Oregon Road Oiling Company's bid of \$39.00 per mile. Moved by councilman Loeding that the contract for oiling the Street be awarded to the Oregon Road Oiling Company. No second to motion. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the bids were rejected and the Recorder was instructed to advertise for bids by the mile and by the barrel, the said bids to be opened at the next regular meeting of the Council to be held on the 12th day of May, 1914. The petition of some of the property owners on Kellogg Lake to have the water in the lake raised by placing a timber across the outlet at the bridge was read, and Mr. Montague of the Montague-O'Reilly Company agreed to place a timber across the outlet at the bridge. Upon motion duly made and carried Ordinance No. 105 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Absent King. Ordinance No. 105 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 105 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. Upon motion of councilman Loeding seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 103 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Absent, King. Ordinance No. 103 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance NO. 103 was taken up for final passage and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Absent, King. Ordinance No. 103 passed the third and final reading.

Ordinance No. 108 entitled " An ordinance granting to L. H. Campbell, his heirs and assigns, the franchise and right to lay, construct and maintain railway tracks and to operate cars thereover and to transport passengers, freight, mail, baggage and express thereon, and to erect, construct, maintain and operate power, telephone and telegraph lines in the Town of Milwaukie, County of Clackamas, State of Oregon," was read and ordered posted. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Counsell and carried ordinance No. 93 was taken up for the first reading. Upon motion of councilman Loeding seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the ordinance was read by sections. Section 1 was read and adopted as read. ~~Sec~~ Sec 2. was read and adopted as amended. Section 3 was read and upon motion of councilman Loeding seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the section was amended by inserting \$1.00 instead of \$1.25, and inserting the words " and Portland Conditions".

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman ~~Al~~ Albee and carried, the ordinance was laid on the table.

Upon motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned subject to the call of the Mayor.

Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 101 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read, the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, Counsell, King and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 101 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 101 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, King, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 101 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 101 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 104 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The matter of penalizing the Montague-O'Reilly Company for the delay in the completion of Front Street was taken up and referred to the Street Committee. The Street Committee recommended that the company be penalized in the sum of \$85.00 per month for five months, the cost of the extra Engineering work caused by said delay. Upon motion of councilman Albee seconded by councilman King and carried, the report of the Street Committee was adopted, and the Recorder was instructed to deduct the said amount from the amount due the Montague-O'Reilly Company.

The Recorder was instructed to draw an ordinance regulating the laying down of water pipes and mains and gas pipes in the Streets of Milwaukie. Upon Motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to make plans and specifications and an estimate of the probable cost of furnishing the Town with Full-run water.

Upon motion of councilman Loeding seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the City Engineer, the Mayor and Water Committee was instructed to interview the Water Commission of Portland in regards to the terms of a contract to furnish the Town of Milwaukie with Full-run Water.

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the Recorder was instructed to advertise the sale of the Water bonds in the Portland Daily Abstract and in the Pacific Banker. Moved by councilman Mitchell and seconded by councilman King that ordinance No. 93, granting the Clackamas
