

Ordinance No. 108 entitled " An ordinance granting to L. H. Campbell, his heirs and assigns, the franchise and right to lay, construct and maintain railway tracks and to operate cars thereover and to transport passengers, freight, mail, baggage and express thereon, and to erect, construct, maintain and operate power, telephone and telegraph lines in the Town of Milwaukie, County of Clackamas, State of Oregon," was read and ordered posted. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Counsell and carried ordinance No. 93 was taken up for the first reading. Upon motion of councilman Loeding seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the ordinance was read by sections. Section 1 was read and adopted as read. ~~Sec~~ Sec 2. was read and adopted as amended. Section 3 was read and upon motion of councilman Loeding seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the section was amended by inserting \$1.00 instead of \$1.25, and inserting the words " and Portland Conditions".

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman ~~Alb~~ Albee and carried, the ordinance was laid on the table.

Upon motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned subject to the call of the Mayor.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MAY THE 5TH. 1914:

A call meeting of the one hundred forty fifth regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, councilmen, Loeding, Mitchell, King, Counsell and Albee, Recorder Mathews and marshal Reed.

Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 101 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read, the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, Counsell, King and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 101 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 101 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, King, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 101 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 101 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 101 passed. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, ordinance No. 104 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 104 passed the first reading.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 104 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 104 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 104 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, Loeding, King, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 104 passed the third and final reading.

The matter of penalizing the Montague-O'Reilly Company for the delay in the completion of Front Street was taken up and referred to the Street Committee. The Street Committee recommended that the company be penalized in the sum of \$85.00 per month for five months, the cost of the extra Engineering work caused by said delay. Upon motion of councilman Albee seconded by councilman King and carried, the report of the Street Committee was adopted, and the Recorder was instructed to deduct the said amount from the amount due the Montague-O'Reilly Company.

The Recorder was instructed to draw an ordinance regulating the laying down of water pipes and mains and gas pipes in the Streets of Milwaukie. Upon Motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to make plans and specifications and an estimate of the probable cost of furnishing the Town with Pull-run water.

Upon motion of councilman Loeding seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the City Engineer, the Mayor and Water Committee was instructed to interview the Water Commission of Portland in regards to the terms of a contract to furnish the Town of Milwaukie with Pull-run Water.

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the Recorder was instructed to advertise the sale of the Water bonds in the Portland Daily Abstract and in the Pacific Banker. Moved by councilman Mitchell and seconded by councilman King that ordinance No. 93, granting the Clackamas

County Gas Company a franchise be reconsidered. Motion lost. Councilman Mitchell and King voting for the motion and councilman Loeding, Counsell and Albee voting against the motion.

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Loeding and carried the ordinance was laid on the table.

Upon motion of councilman Albee seconded by councilman King and carried the City attorney was instructed to draw an ordinance providing for the improvement of Laurel Avenue.

Upon motion duly made and carried the Council adjourned.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MAY 12TH, 1914.

The one-hundred forty-sixth (146) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, councilmen, Loeding, Counsell, King, Mitchell and Albee, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. The minutes of the one-hundred forty-fifth regular meeting of the Town Council held on the 14th day of April, 1914, and the adjourned meetings of the Council held on the 16th day of April, and on the first and 5th days of May, 1914, were read and approved as read.

The following Bills were allowed by the Finance Committee, and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Loeding and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrant on the several funds in payment of the same:

- Hodson-Frenaughty-Co. for igniter for Roller..... \$1.00.
- A. L. Reed for salary.... 45.00.
- A. G. Long, for fire material 4.73
- D. P. Mathews, for salary and drawing 2 ordinances. 30.00
- Frederick Hager for work and material on Wash. St. 39.05.

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the bids for oiling the streets for the season of 1914 were opened and read and referred to the Street Committee. The Street Committee recommended that the bid of the Pacific Road Oiling Company of \$1.37 per barrel for furnishing and distributing the oil over the streets be accepted, it being the lowest bidder. Upon motion duly made and carried, the contract for oiling the Streets for the season of 1914, was awarded to the Pacific Road Oiling Company. Ordinance No. 110 entitled, "An ordinance regulating the laying of water, gas and sewer pipes and mains within the Town of Milwaukie and repealing ordinance No 21, was read and ordered posted.

Ordinance No. 109, entitled "An ordinance providing for the improvement of Laurel Avenue in Milwaukie, Oregon, from Cleveland Street westward to Railroad Avenue, and declaring an emergency," was read and ordered posted.

There being no objections to the acceptance of the improvement of Front Street, upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the improvement of Front Street was accepted. Upon motion of councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Loeding and carried, the 28th day of May, 1914, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P. M. at the City Hall was the time and place set for hearing objections, if any there be, to the proposed assessment for the improvement of Front Street. The bill of J. W. Morris for \$425.00 for extra engineering services on Front Street was read, and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Loeding and carried, the recorder was instructed to draw a warrant in payment of the same, and deduct the amount from the final payment of The Montague-O'Reilly Company. Upon motion duly made and carried the City Attorney was instructed to draw an ordinance declaring the assessment for the improvement of Front Street, and cause the same to be posted as required by the charter. The matter of changing the names of the Streets of Milwaukie, and numbering the houses was taken up and explained by the City Engineer, and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Loeding and carried, the City attorney was instructed to draw an ordinance legalizing the system. Plans and specifications for securing Bull Run water for the Town of Milwaukie were taken up and explained by the City Engineer, and the same being satisfactory to the Council, upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Albee, the City attorney was instructed to draw an ordinance adopting the same.

Petition requesting the Council to grant the Clackamas County Gas Company a franchise was read, and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the proposed franchise was taken from the table. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the franchise was taken up for the first reading. The Franchise being read the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell and King. Nays, Loeding, Counsell and Albee. The franchise failed to pass the first reading. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Loeding and carried, the franchise was indefinitely postponed.

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Loeding and carried, the recorder was instructed to readvertise for bids for the sale of \$20,000.00 of water bonds in the Portland Daily Abstract, and also in the Pacific Banker, said bids to be opened on the 28th day of May, 1914. Council adjourned until May 28th, 1914.
