The City Manager announced that item c, Liquor license application for the Little Store, had been withdrawn by the applicant.

It was moved by Stochosky, seconded by Fuller, that the Consent Calendar be approved, with the exception of item c. Motion carried and so ordered.

RECORDS-COMMUNICATIONS CLERK AND PBX-DISPATCHER POSITIONS
ABOLISHED

It was moved by Martin, seconded by Hupp, that the position of PBX-Dispatcher be abolished, and that one additional position of Clerk Typist be established. It was stated that under the Civil Service Rules, when a position is abolished, the incumbent in the abolished position goes to the top of the Eligible Register in the same or other positions which require basically the same qualifications. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hupp, seconded by Stochosky, that the position of Records-Communications Clerk be abolished, and two new positions of Clerk-Typist be established. Motion carried and so ordered.
