

The one hundred fifty eight (158) regular meeting of the Town Council was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Pelton. Present, Mayor Pelton, Councilmen, Grasse, Bond, Peery, Counsell and Skulason, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Streib and Marshal Riley. The minutes of the one hundred fifty seventh regular meeting held on the 13th day of April 1915 and the minutes of the special meeting held on the 15th day of April 1915, and on the 3rd day of May, 1915, were read and approved as read. The Mayor reported that he had taken the matter of granting the Portland Gas & Coke Company a franchise to lay gas mains in the Town up with the Company and that the Company had agreed to accept a 25 year franchise and supply gas at the rate of \$1.25 per thousand cubic feet and after the Company had secured 100 customers to reduce the rate to \$1.00 per thousand cubic feet. Upon motion of councilman Skulason seconded by councilman Peery and carried, the recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance granting to the Portland Gas & Coke Company a franchise to lay gas mains within the Town of Milwaukie and submit the same to the Company.

Mr. Skulason reported that the restraining order in the case of Perkemeier v. Milwaukie had been vacated.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the recorder was instructed to notify the P. R. L. & P. Co, to remove the arc light from 31st street to 31st and Bellwood Streets, and to remove the light in front of Walker's residence to the intersection of Herman and Washington Streets. Upon motion of councilman Bond seconded by councilman Grasse and carried, the Recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance authorizing Milwaukie to issue improvement bonds to pay a portion of the cost of the improvement of Laurel Avenue. A communication from W. A. Hanson requesting permission to pile wood on certain streets in Milwaukie was referred to the Street Committee with full authority to act. The City Engineer recommended that lateral mains be placed in Leo and Streib's Addition at this time as the same could be done for less money now than later on. He stated that Giebisch & Joplin had made a price of \$88 per foot for 2" Gal. iron pipe laid which price includes taps both to the houses and to the mains and the necessary 2" gates. Upon motion duly made and carried, the recommendations of the City Engineer were adopted and he was instructed to notify Giebisch & Joplin to lay lateral mains in the Leo & Streib's Addition. The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion of councilman Skulason seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same.

Upon motion duly made and carried the Council adjourned.
