

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MAY 11TH. 1931.

The three hundred fiftieth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 11th. day of May, 1931. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Dean and Dell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred fortieth ninth regular meeting of the Council held on the 13th. day of April, 1931, were read and approved as read. Councilman Dean reported that he had the opinions of Mr. John Oatfield and A. H. Zanders as to the value of Lots 7 and 8, Block 28, Milwaukie. Mr. Oatfield valued the property at \$4500.00 and Mr. Zanders at \$4000.00. Councilman Dean also reported that he and Mr. Mathews had interviewed the County Court in regard to purchasing the property from Clackamas County, and that the County Court had agreed to sell the property to Milwaukie for the amount of the taxes against the same, which amounted to \$900.48 with interest from the 14th. day of February, 1931. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant on the Water Fund for the sum of \$913.98 in favor of Clackamas County in payment of the purchase price of Lots 7, and 8; Block 28, Milwaukie, and mail the same to the County Court of Clackamas County. A communication from the Milwaukie Business Mens' Club thanking the Council for cleaning up the garbage dump at the foot of Washington Street was read and ordered placed on file. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 308 establishing official bench marks in Milwaukie was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, Dean and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 308 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and Ordinance No. 308 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, Dean and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 308 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and Ordinance No. 308 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes; Shindler, Sanders, Dean and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 308 passed the third and final reading. Upon motion duly the Union High School was granted the privilege to use sufficient water, without cost; to water the triangular tract of land at 22nd and Willard Streets at Lake Road. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Fire Chief was allowed \$40.00 as expense money for attending the Firemens' School at Corvallis, Oregon. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Milwaukie Band was granted permission to use the City Hall for practice, on nights when Council meetings were not being held; provided, that no smoking be allowed in the hall, and that they clean the Hall after holding meetings.
