

MEETING OF APRIL 27, 1942.
(Cont'd)

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Kemmerer that Section 5 of Ordinance 425 be amended by substituting the words and figures "One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00)" for the words and figures "One Hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125.00)". Officers Burbank and Rigdon stated that considering the great amount of time put in by them in keeping the Bus zone clear and in preventing accidents at the zone that they did not believe either \$100.00 or \$125.00 was sufficient. After considerable further discussion Makin stated that his idea was that he did not want to put any burdens on any Bus Company, although admittedly \$100.00 did not cover the City's expense. The vote on the amendment was taken with the following results: Ayes: Kemmerer, Makin, and Walden. Nays: None. The amendment was declared adopted.

Ordinance Number 425 was read for the second and third times as amended and put on its passage with the following result: Ayes: Kemmerer, Makin and Walden. Naye: None. Ordinance Number 425 passed the Council and it was declared.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Walden that delinquent taxes in the amount of \$19.53 be paid on Lot 3 Block 3 Robert's Re-Plat of J.W.R. Sellwood's Addition, to conform with an agreement made with Mr. Bassnett, (see Minutes of December 11, 1933) Motion carried and so ordered.

A communication from Mr. Henry Wiseman, in which he tendered his resignation as City Treasurer, was read.

It was moved by Walden and seconded by Kemmerer that Mr. Wiseman's resignation be accepted. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Mayor appointed Vivian M. Farrington to be Treasurer for the unexpired term of Mr. Wiseman, which appointment was un-animously confirmed by the Council.

A communication from Frank O. Reed was read and the Recorder was directed to answer same.

A communication from the Business Men's Club was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Kemmerer that the Recorder be directed to issue a warrent in the amount of \$40.00 from the street fund, for the purpose of creating a petty cash fund with which to pay cash wages to tranicent laborers in the Street department. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Kemmerer that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrents for the payment of same.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

557th MEETING

The five hundred fifty-seventh regular meeting of the Council was held on the eleventh day of May 1942.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts; Councilmen Newman, Makin, Walden, and Sperr; Attorney Adams, Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Rigdon, Officer Burbank, and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman Kemmerer, Treasurer Farrington, and Fire Chief Lewellyn.

The minutes of the five hundred fifty-sixth regular meeting of the Council held on the twenty-seventh day of April 1942 were read. Councilman Makin requested that the Recorder include a reference to the minutes of December 11, 1933, which would show reason for the present Council's action in paying delinquent taxes on Lot 3 Block 3 Robert's, Re-Plat of J.W.R. Sellwood's Addition.

A communication from Seth B. Thompson, State Fire Marshal, was read and ordered filed..

Mr. C.P. Schierholz appeared before the Council and offered \$79.10 for Lots 41 and 42, Block 69 Minthorne Addition. He stated he was offering \$20.00 per lot for the City's interest and \$39.10 for the County taxes. It was moved by Makin and seconded by Sperr that the offer be accepted and that the Mayor and Recorder be authorized to execute the necessary Quitclaim Deed, with the understanding that the City was paying the taxes for the sole reason that it appeared it was the only way any fair price could be secured for the property and it restored to the tax rolls. Motion carried and so ordered.

The following Resolution was read by the City Attorney.

WHEREAS, the Milwaukie Branch of the Clackamas County Library receives approximately sixty-eight percent of its total patronage from persons residing without the corporate limits of Milwaukie, and

WHEREAS, the City of Milwaukie has contributed the following to the maintenance of said Library for the past seven years to-wit:

- A. Quarters
- B. Light
- C. Heat
- D. Power
- E. Janitor Service, and

WHEREAS, said contributions aggregate an approximate cost of \$450.00 per year, and

WHEREAS, since Milwaukie is a City with no large industries and has a very low assessed valuation, which results in a high tax levy which the tax paying public demands to be reduced rather than increased, and

WHEREAS, there are large and prosperous corporations, firms and individuals without the boundries of Clackamas County Cities which are not contributing a fair share towards the maintenance of the County Library function,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT, AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED

That the Honorable County Court of Clackamas County exercise its taxing powers by fairly and equitably taxing the entire taxable property of the County for the purpose of maintaining and supporting the Clackamas County Library and all the branches thereof, said County-wide tax to be first levied for the tax year 1942-1943 and to continue each year thereafter.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Walden that the Resolution be adopted and that a copy be sent to the County Court of Clackamas County. Motion carried and so ordered.

A communication from Albert Combs, with reference to City Hall Insurance, was read.

It was moved by Newman and seconded by Makin that the communication be tabled until a later date in order to permit further investigation by the Council. Motion carried and so ordered

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Auditor's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Walden and seconded by Newman that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrents for the payment of same.

MEETING OF MAY 25, 1942.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

The five hundred fifty-eighth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-fifth day of May 1942.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts, Councilmen Newman, Makin, Walden, Sperr, and Kemmerer; Attorney Adams, Water Superintendant Bevington, Marshal Rigdon, Treasurer Farrington, Officer Burbank, and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the five hundred fifty-seventh regular meeting of the Council held on the eleventh day of May 1942 were read and approved as read.

Ordinance Number 426 AN ORDINANCE providing for the regulation of the time and manner of parking automobiles and other vehicles on certain of the streets of Milwaukie, and repealing all other ordinances in conflict herewith, was taken up and read.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Walden that paragraph "A" of Section 3 of Ordinance Number 426 be changed to 30° parking angle instead of 45°. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Kemmerer that Ordinance Number 426 be laid on the table until later. Motion carried and so ordered.

A communication from C.F.Richardson, regarding the City Hall insurance, was read.

An offer of a deed to the City, for a ten foot strip of land in Block 27 Milwaukie, was read. It was moved by Makin and seconded by Kemmerer that the deed be tabled in order that the matter of an alley in Block 27 Milwaukie could be investigated. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Mayor appointed the following committee to make the investigation of an alley in Block 27 Milwaukie. Mr. Kemmerer, Mr. Sperr and Mr Walden.

It was moved by Newman and seconded by Kemmerer that an Ordinance providing a tax levy on all taxable property within Milwaukie, to be drawn and posted.

A petition protesting Ordinance Number 426 as it now reads and requesting that the two hour limit for parking be applied to Main street and one block of Monroe street east of McLaughlin Blvd, only, was read.

The Mayor called upon different business people to voice their opinion in the matter. After some discussion it was shown that a number of business people felt that the Ordinance should be changed.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Newman that Ordinance Number 426 be re-written to conform with suggested changes. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr Peden, of the East Side Busses Inc, appeared before the Council and protested Ordinance Number 425. Mr. Peden stated that in order not to violate the Ordinance, that on and after May 28, 1942 their Busses would not pick up or discharge passengers within the corporate limits of Milwaukie.
