

MEETING OF MAY 12, 1947

676th MEETING

The six hundred seventy-sixth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twelfth day of May 1947.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

The minutes of the six hundred seventy-fifth regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-eighth day of April 1947, were read and approved as read.

Mr. H.A. Davis, came before the Council and made inquiry regarding a roadway running east and west through the unoccupied part of Kellogg Park, and asked for the Council's support in requesting the Regional Office of the United States Housing Authority to reserve such roadway. Councilman Frady suggested that Mr. Davis confer with Manager Taber and that they submit a proposal to be acted upon at the next regular meeting of the Council.

Mr. C.O. Banks came before the Council with regard to his moving a bus on to Lot 5, Block 2, Duerst's Addition, to be used as a tool shop. Mr. Taber reported that he had circulated a petition in the neighborhood and that three residents along 23rd Street had signed the petition stating that they had no objection to the bus being put on the above mentioned property, three property owners in Duerst's Addition had no particular objection but refused to sign the petition, and that six property owners in Duerst's Addition and along 23rd Street were definitely opposed. It was moved by Frady and seconded by Hamlin that the matter of a permit for a dwelling or shop on Lot 5, Block 2, Duerst's Addition be disposed of until such time that a building placed thereon will conform to the building code. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Hamlin that Mr. M.J. Backmeier be permitted to leave his trailer house parked in the old Carver right-of-way at the north end of Elmer Street for a period of 90 to 120 days in order that he may paint and repair the same, provided said Elmer Street is not opened for travel and it being understood that the said trailer house is to remain unoccupied. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Hamlin that Mayor Sperr, Manager Taber, Councilman Hamlin and Mr. Judah (painter) inspect the paint job done on the water tank and, if in the opinion of the City officials present, the job is acceptable, that the Recorder be directed to issue a warrant for the payment of the painting of the tank. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Taber reported that he was preparing a map of the extension of 23rd Street and will confer with the Housing Authority of Clackamas County on the matter.

Manager Taber asked for a little more time on the matter of the widening of 21st Street.

The matter of overtime parking on Main Street was discussed. It was suggested that the two hour parking limit on Main Street be extended south to Washington Street. It was decided that Manager Taber make investigation and recommendation to the Council.

X It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Frady that Manager Taber request Engineering firms to submit proposals for engineering services for the proposed Sewage Disposal Plant, also to act as consultant engineers for the proposed sewer extensions. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Frady that Manager Taber be authorized to write the Public Utilities Commission requesting that wig-wag signals be placed, by the Southern Pacific R.R.Co., at

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their expense, at the following crossings: Oak Street at the main line track, Washington Street at Tillamook Branch track and Monroe Street at Tillamook Branch track. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Frady that a committee be appointed to work with Manager Taber in checking traffic and to make recommendation as to where Stop signs are necessary. Motion carried and so ordered. The following committee was appointed. Officer Delp, Attorney Kirkpatrick, Councilman Nelson, and Water Superintendent Hofmann.

Ordinance Number 495; was taken up and read for the first time. It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Sperr that Ordinance Number 495 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 496 was taken up and read for the first time. It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Sperr that Ordinance Number 496 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Frady that the rules be suspended and that Ordinances 494 and 495 be read for the second time and read by title only. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 495, AN ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance of sewer improvement bonds pursuant to the provisions of the charter and ordinances of the City of Milwaukei, Oregon, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read by title only and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes. Sperr, Hamlin, Nelson and Frady. Nays. None. Ordinance Number 495 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 495, AN ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance of sewer improvement bonds pursuant to the provisions of the charter and ordinances of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read by title only and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes. Sperr, Hamlin, Nelson, and Frady. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 495 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

The Fire Chief's March and April reports were read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Frady that Fire Chief Lewellyn and one member of the Volunteer Fire Department be sent to the Annual Convention of Oregon Fire Chiefs to be held at Hood River. Expenses for the two delegates to be paid. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Frady that the City accept a deed to a street 60 feet wide, in an approximate line with 36th Street, running south of Harrison Street a distance of 300 feet. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Frady that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same
