The one hundred thirty-fourth (134) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukee was held on the above named date.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present: Mayor Elmer, Councilmen Albee, Davis, Counsell, King and Mitchell, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Bolstad and Marshal Davis. The following bills were read and approved by the Finance Committee and upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrant on the general fund for the payment of the same:

The petition of Mr. Hart for a permit to lay a sewer drain across Washington Street was read and referred to the Health Committee and upon motion of councilman Davis seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried the Recorder was instructed to issue Mr. Hart a

permit upon the recommendation of the Health Committee.

A petition of the property owners along Harrison Street to widen said Street along the property owned by the Bonnett Heirs so as to conform with the plans and survey made by Louis Campbell for the improvement of Harrison Street was read, and upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the following resolution was read and adopted as read;

RESOLUTION. 7-1913

WHEREAS, the property owners whose property abuts on Harrison Street have presented a petition, properly signed, to the Council of the Town of Milwaukie for the widening of Harrison Street along the property belonging to the Bonnett heirs so as to conform with the plans and survey made by Louis Campbell for the improvement of said Street, AND

WHEREAS, the council of the Town of Milwaukie deem it expedient and necessary that said Street be widened as petitioned for,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, that the City Engineer proceed, and he is hereby instructed to make a survey of the proposed widening of Harrison Street, and to make a plat of the same, and a written report containing a full and complete description of said widening, and of the boundaries thereof, and the portions of each lot and tract of land to be appropriated therefore.

Mr. Fisch, through his attorney Mr. U'ren, informed the Council that he would not accept the sum of \$5500, the value placed upon his water system by the Arbitration Committee, for his water works, but would accept the sum of \$11000.00 for the same.

The Treasurer stated that when he went to Oregon City to collect the Road money belonging to Milwaukie, the Sheriff informed him that he would require \$5.00 for making a certified copy of the amount of due Milwaukie. Upon motion of Councilman Davis seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the recorder was instructed to investigate the matter.

The petition of Mr. Green for a license to sell spirituous, malt and vinous liquors in the Milwaukie Tavern, in Milwaukie, Oregon, was read and upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the petition was laid on the table.

Ordinance No. 84 entitled "An ordinance establishing and naming Front Street in the Town of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, and Repealing Ordinance No. 79," was read and ordered posted.

Ordinance No. 85 entitled "An ordinance establishing the grades of Front Street from a point 121 feet north of the center line of Scott Street, said point being the North corporate limits of the

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Town at this time, to the South corporate boundary, and repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict therewith", was read and ordered posted. The plans and specifications of the proposed improvement of Front Street, together with an estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, was taken up for consideration and the same being satisfactory to the Council, the following resolution was read and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Davis and carried, the resolution was adopted as read:

RESOLUTION AND NOTICE FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF FRONT STREET IN THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, COUNTY OF CLACKAMAS, STATE OF OREGON.

Whereas, pursuant to an order of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, heretofore made, the City Engineer has filed his report, and filed in the office of the Recorder of said Town of Milwaukie, plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of Front Street according to the petition heretofore filed, together with an estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof,

AND whereas, said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory to the council of the Town of Milwaukie:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the said plans, specifications and estimates be and the same are hereby adopted and approved, AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the purpose and intention of the Town of Milwaukie by its Council to make said improvements, being described as follows, to-wit:

The said Street shall be improved from the Town limits on the North boundary to the Town limits on the South boundary, by grading the street to the established sub-grade, by constructing concrete curbs where the fill does not exceed two feet in depth; by constructing wooden side-walks five feet in width on that portion of the street south of Washington Street except on the West side of street between the point where said street leaves the track of the O. W. P. RY. near Madison Street and the South City boundary; by constructing concrete side-walks six feet wide on that portion of the street North of Washington Street except where the fill exceeds two feet in depth, in which case side-walks are to be constructed of wood; by constructing inlets, catch-basins, drains, headers and other incidentals to a proper improvement; by paving the street fifty feet wide between curbs on that portion north of the point where said street leaves the track of the O. W. P. RY. near Madison Street except on the portions where the fill exceeds two feet in depth in which case macadam is to be used; by paving the street thirty feet in width south of the point where said street leaves the track of the O. W. P. RY. near Madison Street, said thirty feet being the west half of street, except on the portions of the street where the fill exceeds

two feet in depth in which case macadam is to be used; said pavement except where macadam is mentioned to be hard-surface not to exceed one dollar and twenty-five cents per square yard, exclusive of grading, curbs, side-walks, catch-basins, etc.; by filling the trestle at the south boundary of the Town and the trestle near Adams Street to be replaced with a concrete structure as provided by the plans and specifications heretofore filed with the Recorder of Milwaukie and approved by this resolution.

The Town Recorder is hereby directed to cause this resolution and notice to be posted as required by the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon.

Upon motion of Councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the meeting adjourned subject to the call of the Mayor.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MAY 19TH. 1913.

A call meeting of the one hundred thirty-fourth (134) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, Councilmen, King, Mitchell, Albee, Counsell and Davis, Recorder Mathews, and Marshal Davis. Mr. C. F. Davis sent in his resignation as Marshal of the Town of Milwaukie, and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the resignation of Mr. Davis as Marshal was accepted. A majority and minority report of the findings of the Arbitration Committee appointed to appraise the value of the property belonging to the Minthorne Springs Water Company were read and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the minority report was adopted.

The question of the P. R. L. & P. Co. double tracking Front Street was taken up for discussion. The City Engineer suggested that the proper time to double track the street would be before the street was improved, if the Company intended to put in another track on said street, and if the Company did not intend to put in another track on Front Street, it would be to the best interest of the Town to have the present track moved to the center of the street, whereupon the following resolution was adopted by the Council:

RESOLUTION. 9-1913

Inasmuch as the council of Milwaukie, Oregon, acting upon a petition of the abutting property owners, are taking the initial steps towards the improvement of Front Street with hard surface paving from the corporate boundary on the north to the corporate boundary on the south and, that inasmuch as the Portland Railway Light and Power Company have certain tracks located upon a portion of this said
