

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MAY 13TH. 1924.

The two hundred sixty-sixth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 13th. day of May, 1924. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Kerr, Johnson, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred sixty-fifth regular meeting of the Council held on the 8th day of April, 1924, and the minutes of the adjourned meetings of the regular two hundred and sixty-fifth meeting of the Council held on the 21st day of April and the 2nd day of May, 1924, respectively were read and approved as read. Plans and specifications for the improvement of Harvey Street together with estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof having heretofore been filed with the Recorder by the City Engineer, and said plans, specifications and estimates being satisfactory to the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, upon motion duly made and carried, the following resolution was read and approved as read:

RESOLUTION AND NOTICE FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF HARVEY STREET IN THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON.

Whereas, pursuant to an order of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, heretofore made, the City Engineer has filed his report, and filed in the office of the Recorder of the Town of Milwaukie, plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of Harvey Street according to the petition heretofore filed with the Recorder, together with an estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, and

Whereas, said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory to the Council of the Town of Milwaukie:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that said plans, specifications and estimates be and the same are hereby adopted and approved: AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the purpose and intention of the Town of Milwaukie by its Council to make said improvement, which improvement being described as follows:

to-wit:

- (1). By grading said street the full width of forty (40) feet.
- (2). By gravelling the center of said street to a width of sixteen (16) feet and to a depth of eight (8) inches with pit run gravel that has passed through a screen having a circular opening of 2-1/4 inches in diameter.
- (3). By constructing four (4) foot gravel sidewalks on both sides and the full length of the improvement.
- (4). By installing the necessary culverts. All work to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore filed with the Recorder of Milwaukie and approved by this resolution.

The Recorder is hereby directed to cause the resolution and Notice to be posted as required by the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon.

Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 213 entitled, "An ordinance vacating the alleys in Blocks 23, 24, 25, 31 and 32 and all those portions of Luther, Knox, Broadway, Franklin, Irving and Jefferson streets and that part of the public square included within the following described boundaries, as the same appears upon the plat of Milwaukie as filed by Lot Whitcomb in the office of the County Recorder of Clackamas on June 21st. 1865, was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Johnson, Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 213 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 213 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Johnson, Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 213 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 213 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Johnson, Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb. nays, none. Ordinance No. 213 passed the third and final reading.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor was instructed to request the Fire Chief to take the fire hose and clean the drain under Washington Street. Ordinance No. 214 was read and ordered posted. Mr. Alvin Meaney was present and requested the use of the City Hall for band practice. Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Meaney was granted permission to use the side room downstairs in the City Hall for band practice once a week, under the supervision of the City Marshal. Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Miller was instructed to convey lots 18 and 19 in Block 1, Quincy Addition to Mr. Geerlig. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Marshal was instructed to look after the City dumping grounds. The following resolution was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the resolution was adopted as read:

Resolution.

Whereas, it appears that the following described portion of a County Road is within the corporate limits of the Town of Milwaukie, County of Clackamas and State of Oregon, to-wit: Beginning at an iron pipe on the true west line of Front Street in said Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, according to the official plat of the Town of Milwaukie on file in the office of the Recorder of Conveyances of Clackamas County, Oregon; 71.50 feet north 10 degrees west from the intersection of the center line of Jefferson Street and the true west line of said Front Street; thence south 89 degrees west 332.55 feet to an iron spike on the east meander line of the Willamette river; thence south 10 degrees east 60.75 feet following the meander upstream of said Willamette River; thence north 89 degrees east 332.55 feet to a point on the said true west line of Front Street; thence north 10 degrees west 60.70 feet along the said true west line of Front Street to the place of beginning, and

Whereas, the above described portion of said County Road has never been improved by the County, and the Town of Milwaukie desires to acquire jurisdiction over the same:

BE IT RESOLVED, be it resolved by the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, that it is deemed necessary and expedient and for the best interests of said Town of Milwaukie to acquire jurisdiction over the above described portion of said County Road to the same extent as the said Town of Milwaukie has over other public streets and alleys therein:

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town of Milwaukie request the said County of Clackamas and the County Court thereof, to surrender jurisdiction over the above described portion of said County Road.

The Street Committee was instructed to get an estimate of the cost of the repair of Monroe Street bridge.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned until Tuesday the 3rd day of June, 1924.
