TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MAY 13TH. 1929.

The three hundred twenty-sixth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 13th. day of May, 1929. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Sanders, Shindler, Dell and Dean, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred twenty-fourth regular meeting of the Council held on the 11th. day of March, 1929, and the minutes of the three hundred twenty-fifth regular meeting of the Council held on the 8th. day of April, 1929, were read and approved as read.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant on the Street Fund in favor of the Milwaukie Sanitary Sewer Fund for \$100.00 to apply to-ward the payment of the sewer assessment against the Woodard property in payment of property deeded to city by the Woodards for extending Willard Street. Councilman Dell reported that Chas. Counsell had gone over the street with the grader and had removed all excess dirt, and that all the streets were in good shape, except Railroad Avenue. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify the L. D. McFarland Company to keep all poles and logs off of the street in front of its property and to keep the street in repair. The matter of oiling King Street was referred to Councilman Dell to report at the next meeting of the Council.

A petition for the extension of the water main from the intersection of Adams and 40th. Street easterly along the south side of Adams Street to the easterly city limits was read and referred to the Water Supt. Mrs. Grannis was present and requested the Council to allow her to redeem her property on Jackson Street from the sale for delinquent assessments for the improvement of the street by paying the actual amount of the assessment without interest, penalty or cost of sale, for the reason that the assessment was made in the name of another person and that she did not receive notice of the assessment. Upon motion duly made and carried, the request of Mrs. Grannia was granted.

Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 290 entitled, "An ordinance providing for the improvement of 35th. Street in Milwaukie, Oregon, northeasterly from Lake Road to the northerly side of Blocks 20 and 21, Quincy Addition to Milwaukie, and declaring an emergency", was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Dell and Dean. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 290 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 290 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes; Councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Dean and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 290 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 290 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes: Councilmen Sanders, Shindler, Dean and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 290 passed the third and final reading.

Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 291 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance was read but no vote was taken as Councilman Dean stated that the grades established on Jefferson Street by the City Engineer was unsatisfactory. The matter was referred to Councilman Dean for investigation. The report of the City Treasurer was read and ordered placed on file. Upon motion duly made and carried, Geo. A. Taylor was appointed Dance Inspector.

Councilman Dell reported to the Council that many complaints had been made to him that some of the Merchants in Milwaukie had been selling cigarettes to minors. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Marshal was instructed to notify the Merchants of Milwaukie that the law regarding the selling of cigarettes to minors would be strictly enforced.
