COUNCIL CHAMBER'S JUNE 12, 1939

The four hundred ninetyeth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 12th day of June, 1939.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Burdick.

Present: Mayor Burdick, Councilmen Gillem, Kirkpatrick, Mourer, Roberts and Rudder; Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Stanley, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the four hundred eighty-eighth and four hundred eighty-ninth regular meetings of the Council held respectively on the 8th and 22nd days of May, 1939 were each read and were each approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The question of securing insurance on the Marshal's automobile was taken up. The Recorder reported that he had two bids on furnishing coverage as follows: five and ten thousand dollars personal injury, five thousand dollars property damage, fire theft and \$50 deductible collision insurance; that one bid was \$139.50 and one was \$157.35. It appeared that no funds were available for securing the insurance.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Gillem that the Fire Chief be authorized to install ventilators in the rest rooms. Motion carried and so ordered.
