Meeting called to order by mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, councilmen, Davis, King, Albee, Counsell and Mitchell, Recorder Mathews.

The property owners along Front Street were present and presented a petition to have the plans and specifications for the proposed improvement of Front Street changed, but upon the City Engineer explaining the plans and specifications they withdrew their petition and approved the plans and specifications as originally drawn.

upon motion of Councilman Davis seconded by councilman Counsell and carried the meeting adjourned subject to the call of the Mayor.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MAY 27TH 1913.

A call meeting of the one hundred thirty-fourth (134) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present: Mayor Elmer, councilmen, Mitchell, King, Counsell, Davis and Albee and Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed.

Mayor Elmer appointed A. L. Reed as Marshal of the Town of Milwaukie to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of C. B. Davis, and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried the appointment of A. L. Reed as Marshal was confirmed.

A remonstrance of some of the property owners on Front Street against the improvement of Front Street was read and there not being the required number of signers to stop the proposed improvement, the same was ordered filed. The Report of the City Engineer on the proposed extension of Laurel Avenue was read, and the same being satisfactory to the council, Upon motion of Councilman Davis seconded by Councilman Albee and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw an ordinance embodying the same. A petition for oiling the streets was read and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the petition was referred to the Street Committee with full power and authority to act.

A remonstrance, signed by 111 legal voters of the Town of Milwaukie, against the Town purchasing the Minthorne Spring Company's water works was read and order filed. The Bill of Mr. Morris for engineering to the amount of \$638.09 was read and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the recorder was instructed to draw a warrant against the Front Street fund in payment of the same. Upon motion of councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify the

Southern Pacific Company to install a bell signal at the intersection of the Beaverton & Willsburg railroad track with Harrison Street.

Ordinance number 87 entitled "An ordinance for the improvement of Front Street in Milwaukie, Oregon, from the Town limits of the North boundary to the Town limits on the south boundary, in said town", was read and ordered posted. Upon motion of councilman Albee seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the council adjourned subject to the call of the mayor.

A call meeting of the one hundred thirty-fourth regular meeting of the Town council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, councilmen, Mitchell, Davis, King, Albee and Counsell: Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. The proposal of the Oregon Road Oiling Company for oiling the street for the season was read, and upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the Mayor and Recorder was authorized to enter into a contract, on behalf of the Town of Milwaukie, with the Oregon road oiling Company for oiling the Streets of Milwaukie for the season. Said Company to receive as compensation therefor the sum of \$45 per mile for a strip 6 feet in width. Said Oiling to be done to the satisfaction of the council. Ordinance No. 84 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read, the roll-called showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell and Albee: Nays none. Ordinance No. 84 passed first reading. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Davis and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 84 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only, the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell and Albee. Nays, None. Ordinance No. 84 passed the second reading. Upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 84 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only, the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell, and Albee: Nays none. Ordinance No. 84 passed the third and final reading.

Upon motion of councilman Albee seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, ordinance No. 85 was taken up for the first reading.
