The one thousand eightieth meeting of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held on the 27th day of May, 1968. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Robert Richmond, with the following Councilmen present:

Invocation was given by Rev. W. Irby, Assembly of God Church, 10680 Grant Street, Milwaukie.

ZONING ORDINANCE PRESENTATION

Mr. Fred Liddell, Chairman of the Planning Commission, came before the Council and formally presented the Mayor with a final draft of the Zoning Ordinance.

It was moved by Strauss, seconded by Graf, that the Council request, through the City Manager, that copies of this zoning ordinance be distributed to the Attorney, Police Chief, Fire Chief, City Engineer and County Sanitarian, with the directive that it be reviewed and a written response be returned within 30 days. Motion carried and so ordered.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

It was moved by Clore, seconded by Slominski, that the minutes of the regular meeting of May 13, 1968, be approved as written. Motion carried and so ordered.

LIQUOR LICENSE APPLICATION

An application for a liquor license was presented to the Council for a proposed pizza parlor to be constructed in Milwaukie.

It was moved by Slominski, seconded by Strauss, that the Council recommend a Retail Malt Beverage Class A License (RMBA) be granted to Norman A and Marjorie M. Kolln (Pietra's Pizza Parlor). Motion carried and so ordered

ORDINANCE NO. 1174

It was moved by Strauss, seconded by Slominski, that Ord. No. 1174 be taken from the table for its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ord. No. 1174 (AN ORDINANCE CONTROLLING THE DISPOSITION OF DISMANTLED MOTOR VEHICLES IN THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, AND PRESCRIBING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF), was put on its passage with the

following roll call vote: AYES: Strauss, Slominski, Graf, Clore and Richmond.
NOES: None. Ord. No. 1174 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

RELOCATION OF CURBS ON MAIN STREET

It was moved by Strauss, seconded by Clore, that this matter again be held over for further study. (Consideration to be given to a narrower planting strip) Motion carried and so ordered.

LIQUOR LICENSE APPLICATION

It was moved by Slominski, seconded by Strauss, that the Council recommend a Pkg. Store Class B liquor license be granted to Fred Robert and Linda L. Morrow (Fred's Day and Nite Food Service), 9310 SE 32nd St., Milwaukie. Motion carried and so ordered.

COMMUNITY ACTION AGENCY

It was moved by Strauss, seconded by Clore, that the Manager request a 30 day extension of time from the Board of Clackamas County Commissioners, and further request that the Council be provided with legible copies of the application form. Motion carried and so ordered.

CLACKCO WATER AGREEMENT

It was moved by Graf, seconded by Slominski, that the City accept for signing by the Mayor, the Water Sales Agreement between the City of Milwaukie and the Clackamas Water District for service in the Cedarcrest area. Motion carried and so ordered.

STREET VACATION REQUEST

Memo from the Planning Commission was read, recommending that 22nd Street extension between Adams Street and Washington Street be vacated as requested by petition of Mr. R. A. Samuel, Mr. E. Buhite and Dr. Paul Slominski.

It was moved by Graf, seconded by Clore, that July 8th be set as the date for public hearing on the question of street vacation of 22nd St. extension, with notices and publications in accordance with ORS 271.110. Motion carried and so ordered. Councilman Slominski abstained from voting.

TEMPORARY USE PERMIT

Applicant-Hart Realty, for Light Industrial use in 3-R-I zone at 37th & Edison.

It was moved by Strauss, seconded by Slominski, that the Council reject the application for temporary use from Hart Realty. Motion carried and so ordered.

SPECIAL MEETING SET

It was moved by Graf, seconded by Clore, that a special meeting be called for June 3, 7:30 p. m., in the Council Chambers, for the purpose of canvassing the votes from the election held May 28, 1968, and for any other business to come before the Council at that time. Motion carried and so ordered.

BUDGET HEARING DATE

Manager announced that the first hearing on the 1968-1969 budget would be on June 7, 7:30 p. m., in the Council Chambers.


PAYMENT OF BILLS
