

MEETING OF MAY 28, 1945

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

629th MEETING

The six hundred twenty-ninth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-eighth day of May, 1945.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Nelson, Roberts, Rowe and Hamlin; Water Superintendant Counsell, Attorney Kirkpatrick, Engineer Milln and Recorder Martin. Absent: Treasurer Walcott, Fire Chief Lewellm and Officer Butler.

The minutes of the six hundred twenty-eighth regular meeting of the Council held on the fourteenth day of May, 1945, were read and approved as read.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-third day of May, 1945, were read and approved as read.

Engineer Milln presented to the Council a map and description of the proposed City Park in Kellogg Park. Mr. Peter Mortensen, of the P. & C. Tool Co. offered to make blue prints of the map to be given to the Housing Authority of Clackamas County. A letter to the Housing Authority, thanking them for their offer, was ordered written.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Roberts that Engineer Milln's report be accepted. Motion carried and so ordered.

The matter of laying the sidewalk on Monroe St. at the fill over Spring Creek was discussed. It was decided that a committee be appointed to decide on what kind of a guard rail was to be used. The following committee was appointed. Sperr, Counsell and Milln.

Mr. Peter Mortensen made inquiry as to what procedure he should take to have a sewer laid from the P. & C. Tool Company's plant on 32nd Street to the end on the sewer on Harrison Street. Mr. Mortensen was assured that if he could get a petition from the property owners along the proposed sewer route, before the Council, that the City Engineer would be ordered to make the survey and specifications necessary for the laying of the sewer.

Mr. Zarley presented a petition for the proposed sewer on Monroe Street East of 29th Street. It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Hamlin that the petition for a sewer on Monroe Street between 29th Street and Campbell Street be referred to the City Attorney for checking. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Nelson that Mr. D. Barstad be permitted to move a house from 2406 Washington Street to 2226 Washington Street. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Geo. Hall and Mr. Ed. Bolander came before the Council and made inquiry as to obtaining a franchise to operate a taxicab business in Milwaukie. It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Roberts that a Committee be appointed to make proper investigation of a franchise for taxicabs. Motion carried and so ordered. The following committee was appointed: Roberts and Sperr.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Roberts that a committee, with power to act, be appointed to make investigation of the following applications for building permits. Buford Nichols, 1432 32nd St. and Wm. Bohannon 1226 29th street. Motion carried and so ordered. The following committee was appointed. Nelson, Rowe and Sperr.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Roberts that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for payment of the same.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Rowe that the City purchase one Series "F" War Bond at \$740.00 from the General fund to be put in the sinking fund for betterment and improvement purposed. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Rowe that the City purchase two series "F" War Bonds at \$1,480.00 from the Water funds. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Hamlin that the Water Commissioner and May contact Mr. R. H. Strasser with regard to drilling a 12 inch well, and that they be authorized to enter into a contract with him for the same, said contract to be substantially the same as the contract for drilling the city's present 12 inch well, in October 1935, except in price. Motion carried and so ordered.

On motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.

MEETING OF JUNE 11, 1945

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

630th MEETING

The six hundred thirtieth regular meeting of the Council was held on the eleventh day of June, 1945.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present:- Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Hamlin, Nelson, Roberts and Rowe; Water Superintendent Counsell, Attorney Kirkpatrick, Engineer Milln and Recorder Martin. Absent: Treasurer Walcott, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Officer Butler.

The minutes of the six hundred twenty-ninth regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-eighth day of May 1945, were read and approved as read.

Mr. Sperr reported that the committee on the sidewalk on the Spring Creek fill on Monroe Street, had decided it would be better to have a guard rail independent of the sidewalk than one attached to the walk.

Attorney Kirkpatrick reported that he had made examination of the petition for a sewer on Monroe Street, between 29th and Campbell streets, and that he had found that some of the signers were not property owners, or if they were purchasing the property, they did not have their contracts recorded, and that there were not enough signers on the petition who were recorded property owners.

*River Vista* Mr. V. D. Lawrence and other property owners from River Vista came before the Council and requested that the Council accept the street in River Vista in order that they could have a railroad crossing put in at the street. They pointed out that the Portland Traction Co. had refused them a crossing at the street and that without the crossing they would have no means of ingress and egress to their property. It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Nelson that the Mayor appoint a committee to make investigation of the matter. Motion carried and so ordered. The following committee was appointed: Roberts, Sperr, Kirkpatrick, Counsell and Milln.

The bids for putting in sidewalk and curb on Monroe street on the fill over Spring Creek were opened and read as follows:-

Engineer Milln suggested that the Council withhold letting the contract until the committee could arrange the matter of completion date with the contractor.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Roberts that a committee, with power to act, be appointed to investigate an application for a building permit at 915 29th St. Motion carried and so ordered.
