

MEETING OF JUNE 11, 1951

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

774th MEETING

The seven hundred seventy-fourth regular meeting of the Council was held on the eleventh day of June 1951

The meeting was called ot order by Mayor Sperr

Present: Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Taylor, Mullan, Klein and Norbeck; Manager Telford, Attorney Kirkpatrick, Superintendent Hofmann, Police Chief Delp and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the seven hundred seventy-third regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-eighth day of May, were approved as written.

Manager Telford read his report to the Council with regard to the feasibility of the Ardenwald Sanitary District being serviced by our Disposal plant. Mr. Telford showed that the plant was designed to operate for 1,000,000 gallons per day and would operate at 1,500,000 gallons per day without serious problems. Mr Telford anticipated a load of 500,000 gallons, when the plant starts operating, for the City. The anticipated load from Ardenwald Sanitary District, figured by users, as w as the estimate for the city, would be 180,000 gallons per day. Mr. Telford estimated that 7500,000 gallons per day load was a reasonable figure and stated that if, in case of a storm, the catch basins swelled the gallonage, after 3,000,000 gallons per day was reached, the excess would be automatically by-passed to the river. Mr. Telford anticipated no trouble on carrying capacities of existing trunk line users. The next problem was what charge to require for the connection service. Mr . Telford stated that if each user in the Ardenwald district was treated the same as the City users there should be no dissatisfaction on either side, and made the following recommendations:

(A) That the same house connection charge per month be made for both districts.

(B) That a charge be made to the Ardenwald district to off set the City's bonded indebtedness and intrest thereon.

(C) That the Ardenwald district be charged a pro-rated tapping on fee, said fee to be computed back to the first day the City property owners paid taxes on the Sewage Treatment Plant Bond.

(D) That the total cost of construction of the entire Sewer System, including the tap on the Milwaukie sewer lines to be bourn by the by the Ardenwald Sanitary District.

(E) That the mainenance of the Ardenwald Sanitary District sewer system shall be at their cost.

Bids for the Harvester Drive Sewer were opened and read in full. The total figures were as follows:

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Klein that the contract for installing the Harvester Drive Sewer, be awarded to George Abraham, subject to the approval of Manager Telford. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Wm. Charack came before the Council with regard to a proposed bus route between the business district of Milwaukie and an area not to exceed three miles of the city limit line. The Council looked with favor on the proposed bus route and a public hearing was called, by the Mayor, to be held on Monday, June 18 at 8 o'clock P.M. in the City Hall.

Mr. Charack brought up the matter of 33rd, 34th and 35th Streets in Quincy Addition, and requested that the same be accepted by the City. Mr. D.E. Johnson stated that the inspector had approved the streets on April 19, 1951, he did not state who the inspector was. Mr. Telford stated that the streets were not in conformance with the specifications as set forth in Mr. Johnson's contract. There was considerable discussion followed which was joined by several of the residents along these streets who complained of the dust, and chuck holes. The complaints agreed that the "squirrel" driving being done on these streets had done considerable damage to the gravel surface, and had completely changed the condition of the streets since April 19. It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Sperr that the City accept that portion of Mr. D.E. Johnson's contract which deals with street

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improvement of 33rd, 34th and 35th streets, the remaining portions of the contract to be negotiated later, ie, computation of the quantities. Motion carried and so ordered.

The citizens present who live along 33rd, 34th and 35th streets requested that traffic signs be placed along these streets, and that they be policed.

Mr. R.B. Shook came before the Council on behalf of the Garden Club and reported that the public was walking through plantings at the east of the City Hall and doing considerable damage to the shrubs and asked that some effort be made to stop this nuisance.

It was moved by Norbeck and seconded by Taylor that the following resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 5-1951

WHEREAS, it has been recommended by Milwaukie Sportsman's Club and the State Police that the City of Milwaukie establish a fish preserve for the use and pleasure of juveniles in the Milwaukie area, and

WHEREAS, said Sportsmen's Club and State Police will assist the City of Milwaukie in stocking and policing the preserve,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED: That the City of Milwaukie set aside that portion of Johnson Creek which lies within the city limits of Milwaukie and south of the bridge at Road A. Kellogg Park, as a fish preserve during the summer months of 1951, with the privilege of fishing therein to be limited to juveniles under the age of fourteen years only, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the bag limit, days and hours for fishing by said juveniles, shall be determined by a committee composed of the City Manager of Milwaukie, a member of the Milwaukie Sportsman's Club and a member of the State Police. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Klein and seconded by Norbeck that the Milwaukie Transfer and Fuel Co. be permitted to cut more than 20% of their curb along 31st Street for a driveway, said driveway cut to be in accordance with the engineer's specifications. Motion carried and so ordered.

The matter of exclusive right for collection of garbage in Kellogg Park was discussed. Under Ordinance 506, passed December 22, 1947, the Franchise for garbage collection in Milwaukie was given to Milwaukie Sanitary Service, George Deering, owner. Inasmuch as Kellogg Park is within the city limits of Milwaukie, and Mr. Deering is the only collector holding a Franchise to collect garbage in Milwaukie, it was the consensus of opinion of the Council, he would be the only collector eligible to collect during the period covered by a franchise and that any new person making application for a franchise would be denied.

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Norbeck that Ordinance Number 554 be read for its second reading by title only. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance number 554, AN ORDINANCE amending Section 4 of Ordinance Number 139 and repealing Ordinances Nos. 228, 435 and 479; and fixing the charge to be made for water service connection, and declaring an emergency; was taken up and read by title only for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Sperr, Taylor; Mullan, Klein and Norbeck. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 554 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Norbeck that Ordinance Number 555 be read by title only for its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 555, AN ORDINANCE prohibiting persons affected with infections, diseases, in a communicable form from engaging in certain occupations or employment wherein such diseases may be spread; and requiring all persons engaged in such occupation or employment, to obtain a health certificate from the County Health Officer of Clackamas County, Oregon before engaging in such occupation or employment; prohibiting the employment of any such person who has not first obtained a health certificate from the County Health Officer and providing a penalty for the violation hereof; was taken up and read for its second reading by title only and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Sperr, Taylor, Mullan, Klein and Norbeck. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 555 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

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The Police Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by by Taylor and seconded by Norbeck that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same
