

MEETING OF JUNE 12, 1950

SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT BONDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$200,000.00.

WHEREAS: at an election duly called and held on the 15th day of November, 1949, by the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, the said City voted in favor of the issue of bonds in the amount of not to exceed \$200,000.00 for the purpose of constructing a sewerage treatment plant; also intercepting and discharging sewers with the necessary easements for the same

AND WHEREAS: pursuant to said election, a resolution was duly adopted on the 8th day of May, 1950, by the Council of said City, directing that said bonds be issue and sold in the sum of \$200,000.00

AND WHEREAS: that sale of said bonds was duly advertised in the manner provided by law and bids for the purchase of said bonds were duly received and it was found upon opening the bids in the manner provided by law, that the bid of Blyth and Company and the United States National Bank of Portland (Oregon) was the highest and best bidder;

NOW THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED: by the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon:

Section 1. For the purpose of raising the sum of \$200,000.00 for the purpose of providing funds to construct a sewage treatment plant, also intercepting and discharging sewers with the necessary easement for the same, said issue of Sewage Treatment Plant Bonds in the amount of \$200,000.00 is hereby awarded and sold to the highest bidder, being Blyth and Company and The United States National Bank of Portland (Oregon) at the following sum, to-wit:

For all serial maturities from 1951 to 1956, inclusive, bearing interest at the rate of 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ % per annum payable semi-annually and all serial maturities from 1957 to 1960 inclusive bearing interest at the rate of 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ % per annum payable semiannually, both principal and interest payable at the office of the Treasurer of the City of Milwaukie; at the rate of \$100.04 for each \$100.00 face value, together with accrued interest to date of delivery.

Section 2. That the Mayor of said City of Milwaukie and the City Recorder are hereby authorized and directed to do all things necessary to aid in the sale of said bonds, and hereby are further authorized and directed to execute said bonds in the manner heretofore provided by the City Council, and deliver said bonds to said Blyth and Company and the United States National Bank of Portland (Oregon) upon the payment for such bonds to the Treasurer of the City of Milwaukie; and said Treasurer is further authorized and directed to hold the proceeds of the sale of such bonds subject to the order of the City Council, to be used solely for which said bonds were issued.

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Mullan that the foregoing resolution be approved and adopted. A called vote showed the following result. Ayes: Sperr, Taylor, Frady, and Mullan. Nays: None. The motion was carried and so declared by the Mayor.

On motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned to meet again on the morrow, June 13, at 7:30 P.M.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

An adjourned meeting of the Council was held on the thirteenth day of June, 1950.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr; Councilman Taylor, Mullan. (Frady came in at

about 10:30); Attorney Kirkpatrick and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman Norbeck.

Mr. Runyan, of Stevens and Koon, was present and stated that he had made a check-up of the sewer condition on Washington Street between 27 and 28th Streets and recommended that the old sewer be taken up and a new sewer laid in the same ditch using a concrete re-inforcement as a cradle for the pipe. Attorney Kirkpatrick recommended to the Council that the work be done by John Jersey on a machine rental plus 10% basis. It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Mullan that the City employ John L. Jersey at a cost plus 10% basis, to repair the break in the sewer on Washington Street between 27th and 28th Streets. Motion carried and so ordered.

The hearing on the improvement of 33rd, 34th, and 35th Streets was again discussed. There were citizens present who wanted the streets improved. The point was brought out that unless the streets were improved, the vacant property along these streets was difficult to sell as most building was now being done with F.H.A. financing, and objectors who also had property they were desirous of selling, withdrew their objections. It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Mullan that the Council proceed with the improvement of 33rd, 34th, and 35th Streets in Quincy Addition, in accordance with the engineers specifications, and excepting that portion of 35th Street which lies south of Lot 10, Block 16, Quincy Addition. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Mullan that the City of Milwaukee enter into negotiations with the Housing Authority of Clackamas County to furnish them with water in Kellogg Park at a wholesale price of \$3,000.00 per year. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Mullan that the City's piano be tuned at the request and expense of Rebekah Lodge. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Mullan that the Mayor appoint a committee to act in an advisory capacity in matters pertaining to City Hall grounds. Motion carried and so ordered. The Mayor then appointed the following committee: Mrs. Elsie Reddaway, Mrs. Zanas Olson, Mrs. Bernice Sperr, and Mr. Silas Peake.

A letter from Stevens and Koon, with regard to furnishing a resident engineer on the Sewage Disposal Plant job was read. No action was taken on the matter.

At this time Mr. Frady came in.

The Fire Chief's report was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Mullan that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same:
