

MEETING OF JUNE 25, 1956

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

895th MEETING

The eight hundred ninety-fifth regular meeting of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, was held on the twenty-fifth day of June, 1956.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Perkins, Shook and Klein; Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the eight hundred ninety-fourth regular meeting of the Council, held on the eleventh day of June, 1956, were approved as written.

It was moved by Shook and seconded by Clay that the following transcribed Resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 10-1956

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE COUNTY COURT OF CLACKAMAS COUNTY, OREGON TO SURRENDER JURISDICTION OVER PORTIONS OF CERTAIN COUNTY ROADS, AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO REQUEST SUCH SURRENDER OF JURISDICTION ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE.

WHEREAS, it has been considered and deemed necessary and expedient and for the best interests of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, that the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, acquire jurisdiction over certain portions of County Roads lying within the corporate limits of said city as the same are hereunder described.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that by virtue of the foregoing and by virtue of the provisions of Section 373.270, Oregon Revised Statutes, that the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, do, and it hereby does request the County Court of the County of Clackamas and State of Oregon to surrender jurisdiction over the following portions of County Roads as the same now lie within the corporate limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, said portions of such County Roads being described as follows:

1. That portion of S.S.Fields Road, sometimes known as Railroad Avenue, as the same extends from Adams Street easterly to 46th Street, sometimes known as Walsh Road, within the corporate limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon.
2. That portion of 42nd Street as the same extends from S.S.Fields Road, sometimes known as Railroad Avenue, to the north line of King Street, within the corporate limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon.
3. That portion of Rio Vista Avenue, as the same extends from S.S.Fields Road, sometimes known as Railroad Avenue, to the East boundary of Keil Heights, within the corporate limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon.
4. That portion of Franklin Avenue, as the same extends from S.S.Fields Road, sometimes known as Railroad Avenue, to the East boundary of Keil Heights, within the corporate limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon.
5. That portion of Jefferson Street, as the same extends from 42nd Street, to the East boundary of Keil Heights, within the corporate limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon.
6. That portion of Llewellyn Street, as the same extends from 42nd Street to the East side of 44th Street, within the corporate limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon.
7. That portion of King Street, as the same extends from the East side of 40th Street to the East side of 44th Street, within the corporate limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon.
8. That portion of 40th Street, as the same extends from the North line of Howe Street to the South side of King Street, within the corporate limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon.

9. That portion of 40th Street, as the same extends from S-S Fields Road, sometimes known as Railroad Avenue, to Adams Street, within the corporate limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon.

10. That portion of 46th Street, sometimes known as Walsh Road, from S.S. Fields Road, sometimes known as Railroad Avenue, to its northerly terminus, within the corporate limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon be and he hereby is authorized and directed to request of the County Court of Clackamas County, Oregon the surrender of jurisdiction over the portions of the County Roads as hereinabove described on behalf of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon.

Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder announced that this was the time set for the hearing on the annexation of Blocks 12 and 17 Minthorn Addition, with certain exceptions, and the Davenport Tract along River Road. The Mayor called for objections to the annexation of the above mentioned territories to the City of Milwaukie, Oregon. There were no objections. Ordinance Number 644 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Perkins and seconded by Klein that Ordinance Number 644 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder announced that this was the time set for hearing on the construction of a sanitary sewer along Jefferson Street in Keil Heights. The Mayor called for objections to the construction of sanitary sewer in Jefferson Street Keil Heights. There were no objections. Ordinance Number 645 was taken up and read in full for its first reading. It was moved by Shook and seconded by Clay that Ordinance No. 645 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

The recorder announced that this was the time set for hearing on the construction of sanitary sewers along Adams Street, Rio Vista Street, Franklin Street in Keil Heights and Minthorn Addition and Walsh Road, also known as 46th Street and S.S. Fields Road, also known as Railroad Avenue. The Mayor called for objections to the construction of sanitary sewers along the streets as listed above. There was no objection. Ordinance Number 646 was taken up and read in full for its first reading. It was moved by Shook and seconded by Klein that Ordinance Number 646 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mrs. Regina S. Curl, Secretary for the S.E. Johnson Creek Water Control District, again came before the Council with regard to approval of the above mentioned District becoming a tax levying body. It appeared that the Council felt that they did not have a full understanding of the obligations which could develop in the future in maintaining the work which would be done by the Federal Government; further they felt that the maintenance should be borne by the area benefitted by the flood control and that the land, owned by the City, in Milwaukie Industrial Park, would in no wise be benefitted. Attorney Sheldahl read the Oregon Laws pertaining to the case. It was moved by Shook and seconded by Clay that the City's approval, of this tax levying district, be withdrawn and that action taken by the Council on June 11, 1956, be rescinded, and that the S.E. Johnson Creek Water Control District be so notified. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Theren Sedgwick and Mr. Robert Staley appeared before the Council and presented a tentative description of the outlines of a district north and east of the present City limits, which propose to annex to the City, and asjed if the same would be acceptable to the Council. The Council voiced their willingness to cooperate and advised these gentlemen to have an accurate outline in-

cluded in their formal application for annexation.

Manager Burdick read the Fire Chief's annual Report on the inspection of homes and dwellings within the City and in the Rural Fire Protection District, showing that the total number of such calls made inside the City to 1097 and the total number of calls made in the Rural Fire Protection District to be 794;

Manager Burdick opened Bids for a new Police Car as follows:

The Bids were turned over to Mayor Mullan, to be analyzed by the Mayor, City Manager and Chief of Police.

There was discussion on the matter of the appointment of a Park Commission on this matter.

The meeting was called for the purpose of a public hearing on the City Budget for 1956-57, was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Shook and Klein and Manager Burdick.

Absent: Councilmen Clay and Perkins; Attorney Sheldahl and Recorder Martin.

The Mayor called for objections to the proposed City Budget for 1956-57.

There were no objections.

It was moved by Klein and seconded by Shook that the 1956-57 Budget for the City of Milwaukie, be adopted. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 647 was taken up and read in full for its first reading.

It was moved by Shook and seconded by Klein that Ordinance Number 647 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Klein and seconded by Shook that \$4556.96 be transferred from Sewer Improvement fund to the General Fund and that \$6720.94 be transferred from the Emergency Fund to the General Fund. Motion carried and so ordered.

There being no further business to come before the Council at this time on motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.
