SPECIAL MEETING

The City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, convened in special session at the City Hall in Milwaukie on the 3rd day of June, 1968, by call of the Mayor for the purpose of canvassing the results of election held May 28, 1968, and any other business that might arise.

The Mayor called for the canvass of election returns as submitted by the County Clerk, on the city's measures voted on at the State Primary Election held May 28, 1968.

It was moved by Clore, seconded by Strauss, that the City accept the results of the election presented by the County Clerk and that the following resolution be read and adopted. (Res. No. 51-1968) Motion carried and so ordered.

RESOLUTION NO. 51-1968

WHEREAS, at the same time as the State Primary Election on the 28th day of May, 1968, there was also a vote on certain City matters, all of which were conducted and supervised by Clackamas County Clerk, and

WHEREAS, the Clackamas County Clerk has certified to the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, the vote of the people on certain City issues,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that the City of Milwaukie, by and through its Council does hereby canvass the vote and accepts and approves the following count as certified by the Clackamas County Clerk:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO CITY CHARTER




Mayor Robert E. Richmond declared the above proposed Charter Amendment has been defeated.
