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Southern Pacific Company to install a bell signal at the intersection of the Beaverton & Willsburg railroad track with Harrison Street.

Ordinance number 87 entitled "An ordinance for the improvement of Front Street in Milwaukie, Oregon, from the town limits of the North boundary to the town limits on the south boundary, in said town", was read and ordered posted. Upon motion of councilman Albee seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the council adjourned subject to the call of the mayor.

A call meeting of the one hundred thirty-fourth regular meeting of the Town council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, councilmen, Mitchell, Davis, King, Albee and Counsell: Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. The proposal of the Oregon Road Oiling Company for oiling the street for the season was read, and upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the Mayor and Recorder was authorized to enter into a contract, on behalf of the Town of Milwaukie, with the Oregon road oiling Company for oiling the Streets of Milwaukie for the season. Said Company to receive as compensation therefor the sum of \$45 per mile for a strip 6 feet in width. Said Oiling to be done to the satisfaction of the council. Ordinance No. 84 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read, the roll-called showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell and Albee: Nays none. Ordinance No. 84 passed first reading. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Davis and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 84 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only, the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell and Albee. Nays, None. Ordinance No. 84 passed the second reading. Upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 84 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only, the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell, and Albee: Nays none. Ordinance No. 84 passed the third and final reading.

Ordinance No. 88 entitled "An ordinance adopting the survey, plat and report of the City Engineer on the proposed extension of Laurel Avenue, in the Town of Milwaukie, and declaring an emergency," was read and upon motion of counsell Davis seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the ordinance was ordered posted. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the Marshal was instructed to remove the flag pole.

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried the Recorder was instructed to advertise for bids for the sale of \$20,000 of water bonds of the Town of Milwaukie. Said bonds to be dated the 1st day of July, 1913. Said advertisement to run for a period of ten days in one of the daily papers of the City of Portland, and one insertion to be placed in some financial paper to be selected by the Recorder.

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the City Engineer was given a further ten days of time to file his survey report and plat of the proposed widening of Harrison Street.

No further business coming before the meeting, upon motion of councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the council adjourned.
