Counsell for the improvement of 32nd Street, upon Mr. Counsell furnishing a satisfactory bond. Mr. Walker was present and presented specifications for the repair of 30th Street, and informed the Council that he would be responsible for the payment of the money subscribed by the property owners along said Street toward the repair of the same. The Council authorized Mr. Walker to proceed with the repair of said 30th Street.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JUNE 8TH. 1921.

The two hundred thirty-first regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, councilmen, Albee, Shindler, Miller, Hart and Counsell, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Strieb and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred thirtieth regular meeting of the Council held on the 3rd day of May, 1921, and the minutes of the special meeting of the Council held on the 18th day of May, 1921, were read and approved as read. Mr. Skulason was presented and informed the Council that he had interviewed the Attorneys for the City of Portland in the Telephone Rate re-hearing and that they advised him that they would only look after the interest of the City of Portland. Mr. Skulason stated that the Town should have an attorney to represent it at the rehearing and said that he would represent Milwaukie for a fee of \$200.00.

Mrs. Johnson was presented and stated that she thought the Town should employ an attorney to represent it at the Telephone rehearing and informed the Council if it would appropriate \$100.00 toward the attorney fee that Jennings Lodge and Oak Grove would contribute alike sum. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council employed Mr. Skulason to represent Milwaukie at the Telephone rehearing and appropriated \$100.00 toward his fee. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council donated the use of Mr. Counsell's Truck for Cleanup day.
