

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JUNE 8TH. 1931.

The three hundred fifty-first regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held on the 8th. day of June, 1931. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Dell and Dean, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck,

The minutes of the three hundred fiftieth regular meeting of the Council held on the 11th. day of May, 1931, were read and approved as read. Mr. Adams of the Business Men's Club was present and asked the Council to make a donation to help provide a play ground for the children. Upon motion of Councilmen Dell duly second and carried, the Council donated the sum of \$75.00 toward providing a play ground for the Children, and the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant in that amount in favor of the Milwaukie Business Men's Club. Mr. Linden was present and asked the Council the amount of the bond that the City would require before the Council would allow him to haul logs over the paved streets and dump the same into the river at the foot of Jefferson Street. Mr. Linden was advised that the city would require a surety bond in the amount of \$2000.00. The application of the City Treasurer for a two weeks vacation with pay was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the request was granted. The Recorder was instructed to write the State Board of Health and ask them to ~~analyze and test the water in Kellogg Creek and Kellogg Lake~~ to make a report on the condition of the water in Kellogg Creek and Kellogg Lake. Mr. Porter and Mr. Elliott stated that the necessary sewer equipment would cost the city \$534.00 as that was the lowest price quoted.

They were requested to write and get other prices on the necessary sewer equipment.
