

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JUNE 9TH. 1930.

The three hundred thirty-ninth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 9th. day of June, 1930. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Dell and Dean, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred thirty eighth regular meeting of the Council held on the 12th. day of May, 1930, were read and approved as read. Councilman Sanders reported that Mr. Hunter of the Poles Plant advised him that the Company would repair Railroad Avenue and keep the poles off the street. The Street Supt. was instructed to have three loads of gravel put on Jackson Street. The application of O. G. Porter for the position of City Engineer was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. O. G. Porter was employed as City Engineer, and to receive \$9.00 per day for special work, and for Street and Sewer improvements to receive the commission provided in the City Charter.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor and Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant in favor of Philip Streib for \$400.00 in payment of that portion of the Paetsch property required by the city in straightening Harrison Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to prepare a description of the property needed by the city for straightening Harrison Street and prepare plans and specifications for the improvement of Harrison Street at 22nd Street. A communication from the S. P. Co. advising the Council that the Company did not furnish caution signs was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to send a copy of the letter to the League of Oregon Cities. Mayor Miller appointed Councilmen Dean and Sanders as a committee to see the S. P. Company and see if it would not re-consider and furnish Milwaukie with the necessary caution signs at it railroad crossings.

Mr. W. H. Grastle was present and advised the Council that the gutter on Lake Road in front of his property was filled with dirt and rubbish and interfered with the drainage and asked the Council if they would have the same fixed. The Street Supt. was instructed to clean the gutter on Lake Road as requested by Mr. Grastle.

Mr. Schierholz was present and asked the Council if they intended to fix Washington Street at 40th Street. The Street Supt. advised Mr. Schierholz that he would fix the street.

Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 305 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read, the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, Dean and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 305 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 305 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, Dean and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 305 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and Ordinance No. 305 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. the roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, Dean and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 305 passed the third and final reading.
