

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JUNE 10TH. 1929.

The three hundred twenty-seventh regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held on the 10th. day of June, 1929. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Sanders, Shindler, Dean and Dell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred twenty-sixth regular meeting of the Council held on the 13th. day of May, 1929, were read and approved as read. Councilman Sanders reported that the County Engineer had established the grades of the County Road along 40th. Street, and that Jefferson Street at the intersection of 40th. Street was at grade. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to advertise for bids for the improvement of 35th. Street in the Daily Journal of Commerce, the bids to be opened on the 24th. day of June, 1929. Ordinance No. 292 entitled, "An ordinance ~~xxxxxxx~~ establishing the grades of 35th. Street in Milwaukie, Oregon, northeasterly from Lake Road to the northerly side of Blocks 20 and 21, Quincy Addition to Milwaukie, and declaring an emergency," was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, Dean and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 292 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 292 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, Dean and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 292 passed the second reading.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 292 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, Dean and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 292 passed the third and final reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to establish the gades of Willard Street from 22nd Street easterly to 27th. Street, and also to establish the grades of 22nd. Street from Lake Road northerly to the north boundary line of the Union High School real property. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Marshal was instructed to ring the Curfew Bell from June 1 to Sept. 1 at 10 o'clock P. M. instead of 9:00 o'clock P. M. Mr. Dahlman was presented and asked the Council for a donation for the Milwaukie Band. The Council advised Mr. Dahlman that they had no authority to donate city money for the purpose of maintaining a band. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant for \$2000.00 on the General Fund in favor of the Water Fund in payment of the money borrowed from Water Fund. The Recorder and Treasurer were instructed to try and get in touch with the owners of the outstanding water bonds in order that the Council may take up and retire \$8000.00 of the bonds.

The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:
