Upon motion duly made and carried, the offer of Mr. Schuebel was accepted upon condition that Gussie Keck repair the sidewalk on front of said property and keep the same in repair at her own expense, and release the Town of Milwaukie from any and all claims which she may have for damages by reason of the improvement of Front Street.
