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of Ordinance No. 140 by providing for reduction of rates on water used in excess of the minimum during July, August, September, and October of each year, and repealing Ordinance Number 305, and all other Ordinances in conflict herewith." was taken up for consideration and was read for the first time. Upon motion duly made and carried Ordinance Number 351 was taken up for the second time and read by title only. Upon motion duly made and carried Ordinance Number 351 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. Ordinance Number 351 was put on its passage. The roll call being taken the following result was had: Ayes: Burdick, Dell, Sanders, Walsh and Willis. Noes, none. Ordinance Number 351 duly passed the council.

The revised proposed street lighting contract with Portland General Electric Company was taken up for consideration and read. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Walsh that the Mayor and Recorder be authorized to execute the same. Motion carried and so ordered.

R.M. Rivers appeared before the Council and made the following requests:

1. That steps be taken to have the debris of the old Hawley Pulp & Paper Co. mill removed.
2. That the State Highway Commission be asked to beautify the Super-highway through Milwaukie.
3. That the County Planning Board be asked to include the making of a map of Milwaukie and vicinity among its activities.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Shrock that the Recorder take care of each of Mr. Rivers requests. Motion carried and so ordered.

W.O. Parks of the Union High School Board stated that the Union High School District had had a leak in its water line which had resulted in the District losing a huge quantity of water and hence that the water bill of the District was about three times as large as normal. Mr. Parks asked that in view of the circumstances that the District be not charged the full rate on all water used in excess of a normal bill. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Walsh that Union High School District No. 5 be rebilled for water used during the two months of May and June on the basis of a full bill for the normal quantity of water used by the District for the same period in previous years and that all water used in excess of that amount be charged for at the rate of 14.8 cents per hundred cubic feet. Motion carried and so ordered.

The matter of the rent to be charged to Messrs. Burton and Roberts for the occupying of the East Milwaukie Fire Hall with a cannery was taken up. It was moved by Walsh and seconded by Shrock that the matter be layed on the table until it is known where the County Cannery is to be located. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance licensing businesses.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Walsh that the following bills be approved and that the Recorder issue warrants for the same.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, JULY 8, 1935

The four hundred second regular meeting of the Council was held on the 8th day of July, 1935.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders;

Present: Mayor Sanders; Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Shrock and Walsh;
Water Superintendent Bevington; Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the four hundredth and four hundred first regular meetings were each read and were each approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

A communication from the Hawley Pulp & Paper Co. requesting that it be allowed to keep the debris of its burned mill in status quo pending the trial of its lawsuit with the insurers of the mill was read. No action was taken on the request.

James Roberts appeared and requested a year's lease on the old East Milwaukee Fire Hall for the purpose of operating a cannery therein. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Burdick that the Mayor and Recorder be authorized to execute a lease leasing the old East Milwaukee Fire Hall to James Roberts for a period of one year from July 15, 1935 at a monthly rental of \$5.00 per month and providing that the lessee pay for all lights, water, and gas and insure the property against fire to the extent of \$200.00. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. J.F. Maurer appeared and offered to sell the city its wood supply for the ensuing year. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Burdick that the matter be layed on the table until the first meeting in August.

The Recorder stated that the former owner, R. SPRAGUE, of lot 26, block 9, Quincy Addition had offered to pay \$25.00 in full payment of all liens against the property. It was developed that the City had not recorded its deed until several years after the property had been sold and that Mr. SPRAGUE had paid the taxes during that period and had just discovered that the City had title to the property. It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Walsh that if Mr. SPRAGUE paid \$25.00 within 10 days that the Mayor and Recorder be authorized to deed the property back to him. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder read three ordinances relative to peddlers, hawkers and occupations. The matter was layed on the table until the next meeting.

The following bills were read and it was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dell that the Recorder issue warrants for the same. Motion carried and so ordered.
