COUNCIL CHAMBERS, JULY 12, 1937

The four hundred forty-sixth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 12th day of July, 1937.

The meeting was called to order by Acting Mayor Burdick. Present: Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Mourer and Roberts, Water Superintendent Bevington, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the four hundred forty-fourth and four hundred forty-fifth regular meetings of the Council held respectively on the 14th and 28th days of June, 1937 were each read and were each approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Librarian's semi-annual report for the period ending June 30, 1937 was read and ordered filed.

The resignation of Wm T. Elsing as City Marshal by reason of his removal from the City was read. Inasmuch as the letter of resignation was unsigned it was moved by Dell and seconded by Roberts that the office of Marshal be declared vacant. Motion carried and so ordered.

Acting Mayor Burdick announced the appointment of E. A. Stanley as City Marshal. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Roberts that the appointment of E. A. Stanley to the office of City Marshal be confirmed. Motion carried and so ordered.
