MEETING OF JULY 8, 1957

COUNCIL CHAMBER

912th MEETING

The nine hundred twelfth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie, was held on the eighth day of July, 1957.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan, Councilmen Mortensen and Roberts; Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Clerk Martin. Absent: Councilmen Clay and Klein.

The minutes of the nine hundred eleventh regular meeting of the Council held on the tenth day of June, 1957, were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the twentieth day of June, 1957 were approved as written.

Mr. Price, Mrs. Shaw and Mrs. Peters, from Sellwood Gardens, came before the Council and made inquiry as to when the City's water system would be extended to Sellwood Gardens. Manager Burdick reported that the large water main was now being laid and that Milwaukie water would soon be available to them.

Manager Burdick reported that Campbell Street, from Monroe Street to Harrison Street, was now satisfactorily graded and paved.

Ordinance Number 666, AN ORDINANCE providing for the rezoning of Tax Lot 40, a part of the Lot Whitcomb D.L.C. and amending Ordinance 481 accordingly and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read in full for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Mullan, Mortensen and Roberts. Naves: None. Ordinance Number 666 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Manager Burdick presented a deed, from owners of Tax Lot 40, Whitcomb D.L.C. for Campbell Street, through the said Tax Lot 40. It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Mortensen that the deed to this portion of Campbell Street be accepted. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Clerk announced that this was the time set for a hearing on the assessment for curbs along Main Street north of Luelling Addition. The Mayor called for objections to the assessment. There was no citizen present who objected and there were no written objections. Ordinance Number 677 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Roberts that Ordinance Number 677 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

Bids were opened and read for the laying of a water main along Beta Street and for the construction of a sanitary sewer along a portion of Main Street, as follows:

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Mortensen that the bids be referred to the City Manager and the Engineer and that the contract be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder and that the Mayor be authorized to sign the contract. Motion carried and so ordered.

A petition, signed by property owners in Block 3 Robertson's Re-Plat, requesting that curbs and sidewalks be constructed along the southeast side of Penzance Street. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Roberts that the following Resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 13, 1957

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE COUNCIL OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON TO CONSTRUCT CURBS AND SIDEWALKS ALONG THE SOUTHEASTERLY SIDE OF PENZANCE STREET, FROM ITS INTERSECTION WITH WASHINGTON STREET TO THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF LOT 26, BLOCK 3, ROBERT'S RE-PLAT OF J. R. W. SELLWOOD'S ADDITION.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary to construct curbs and sidewalks along the southeasterly side of Penzance Street from its intersection with Washington Street to the northeast corner of Lot 26, Block 3, Robert's Re-Plat of J.R.W. Sellwood's Addition, and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, has required from the City Engineer, plans and specifications for the appropriate improvement to accomplish the above, and an estimate of the cost of the work to be done, and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has heretofore filed such plans and specifications and estimates in the office of the City Recorder

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon does hereby declare its intention and purpose to make such improvement, the location and kind of improvement being as follows:

By construction of curbs and sidewalks along the southeasterly side of Penzance Street, along the following lines and termini:

Beginning at the northwest corner of Lot 17, Block 3, Robert's Re-Plat of the J.R.W.Sellwood's Addition, thence northeasterly along the northwesterly boundary of Block 3, of said Addition to the northeast corner of Lot 26, said Block 3, and to do all things necessary in the construction of said curbs and sidewalks, all to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications now on file in the office of the City Recorder, which plans and specifications are hereby referred to and made a part of this resolution.

That the Engineer's estimate of the probable cost of such improvement is the sum of \$1870.00.

That the district liable to be assessed for the said improvement is as follows:

LOTS 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, Block 3, ROBERT'S RE-PLAT of J. R. W. SELLWOOD'S ADDITION AND LOT 8 WILSON TRACT. (See minutes of August 12, 1957.)

The City Engineer's estimate of the cost per each front foot is \$2.90.

That an assessment will be levied on all lots or parcels of land within the said proposed district, where said curbs and sidewalks will be constructed, in proportion to the amount to which each lot or parcel of land is benefitted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that written remonstrance against said proposed improvement may be filed with the City Recorder on or before the TWELFTH DAY OF AUGUST, 1957.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief of Police of the City of Milwaukie shall, within ten days from the adoption of this Resolution, give notice of the adoption hereof, by posting a notice headed with the title "NOTICE OF CURB AND SIDEWALK CONSTRUCTION WORK" in three public and conspicuous places along said portion of Penzance Street, which said notice shall contain a copy of this Resolution and shall specify the time in which the remonstrances against the proposed improvement may be filed with the City Recorder; and that the Council will hear such remonstrances as may be filed on the 12th day of August, 1957, at the hour of eight (8:00) o'clock P.M. in the Council Chamber of the City Hall, 926 Main Street, Milwaukie, Oregon

AND WHEREAS, it is necessary that said improvement be made as soon as possible so as to take advantage of weather conditions in the construction of said improvement; NOW THEREFORE AN EMERGENCY IS DECLARED TO EXIST and this Resolution shall go into full force and effect immediately after its passage.

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE COUNCIL OF MIL-
WAUKIE, OREGON, TO CONSTRUCT CURBS AND SIDEWALKS ALONG BOTH SIDES OF
29th STREET, WHERE NONE NOW EXIST OR WHERE THEY DO EXIST BUT DO NOT
CONFORM TO CITY STANDARDS AS TO ALIGNMENT, GRADE OR QUALITY, FROM ITS
INTERSECTION WITH HARRISON STREET, NORTHERLY TO THE CITY LIMIT LINE.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, deems it
expedient and necessary to construct curbs and sidewalks along both
sides of 29th Street from its intersection with Harrison Street northerly
to the City limit line where none now exist or where such as do exist
do not conform to City standards as to alignment, grade or quality, and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, has
required from the City Engineer, plans and specifications for the appro-
priate improvement to accomplish the above, and an estimate of the cost
of the work to be done, and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has heretofore filed such plans
and specifications and estimates in the office of the City Recorder

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Mil-
waukie, Oregon, does hereby declare its intention and purpose to make
such improvement, the location and kind of improvement being as follows:

By the construction of curbs and sidewalks along both sides of
29th Street, where none now exist or where such as do exist do not conform
to City standards as to alignment, grade or quality, along the following
lines and termini:

Beginning at the intersection of 29th Street with Harrison Street, thence northerly to the intersection of Harrison Street with the city limit line, and to do all things necessary in the construction of said curbs and sidewalks, all to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications now on file in the office of the City Recorder, which plans and specifications are hereby referred to and made a part of this resolution.

That the City Engineer's estimate of the probable cost of such improvement is the sum of \$3275.25.

That the district liable to be assessed for the said improvement is as follows:

Beginning at the northwest corner of Lot 1, Block 1, Brownell Acres, thence southerly along the westerly boundary of Block 1, Brownell Acres to the southwest corner thereof, thence easterly along the northerly boundary of Harrison Street to the center line of Block 2, Brownell's Acres, thence Northerly along the said center line of Block 2 Brownell's Acres, to the Northerly boundary of Brownell's Acres, thence Westerly along the northerly boundary of Brownell's Acres to the point of beginning.

The City Engineer's estimate of the cost per foot for curbs is \$3.15.

That an assessment will be levied on all lots and parcels of land within said proposed district, where said curbs and sidewalks will be constructed, in proportion to the amount to which each lot or parcel is benefitted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that written remonstrance against said proposed improvement may be filed with the City Recorder on or before the 12th day of August, 1957.

SPECIAL MEETIN OF JULY 15, 1957

A special meeting of the Council of the City of Milwaukie was held on the fifteenth day of July, 1957, at the call of the Mayor, for the purpose of the second reading of Ordinance Number 677 and such other matters as were necessary to come before the Council at this time.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein; Manager Burdick and Clerk Martin. Absent: Attorney Sheldahl.

Ordinance Number 677 AN ORDINANCE declaring an assessment for the improvement of Main Street from State Highway Engineer's Station 337+00 to State Highway Engineer's Station 347+20 by curbs, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read in full for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein.
