

MEETING OF JULY 14th, 1952

Council Chamber

800th Meeting

The 800th regular meeting of the Council was held on the 14th day of July, 1952.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen, Mullan and Klein; Attorney Kirkpatrick, treasurer Dillery, Superintendent Hofmann; Police Chief H. Delp.

In the absence of Recorder Martin, Mayor Sperr announced the appointment of E. W. Kirkpatrick as recorder pro tem.

The minutes of the 799th regular meeting of the Council held on the 23rd day of June, 1952, were read and approved as written.

Discussion on the cutting back of curbs along the East side of 27th St. was invited by the mayor; Messers "ager, Sirianni and Olson and Mrs. Hahn spoke against the proposition; it was decided by the Council to take the matter under advisement and make a further investigation.

It was moved by Councilman Klein, seconded by Councilman Mullan, that the revised proposal of Perkins Eros. as set forth in their letter dated July 14, 1952, be accepted as to the improvement of Monroe and Campbell St. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Councilman Mullan and seconded by Councilman Klein, that if no further fire hydrants are necessary in the immediate area, that Acting manager Sperr be authorized to go ahead with the Penzance water main project as outlined by Acting Manager Sperr.

Acting manager Sperr reported on the condition of the Washington St. sewer; reporting that it was believed after an inspection that water main leak was getting water into the sewer in the vicinity of Myrtle and Washington; and that an early test would be made for such leak.

No action was taken in regard to roof sprinkling on the off days.

It was moved by Klein and seconded by Mullan, that water service to a four-plex apartment house in Kirkemeier addition be served with water through one meter, by that water be billed so as to require four minimums. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Mullan and seconded by Klein; that Housing Authority be given a permit to burn in accord with their letter addressed to the Mayor and Council, provided a fire truck is available, such truck to be manned by volunteers, who are to be paid by the Housing Authority for such service.

It was moved by Klein, seconded by Mullan that the following bills be approved and that warrant checks be drawn for their payment.

MEETING OF JULY 28, 1952

Council Chambers

801st MEETING

The eight hundred first regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-eighth day of July, 1952.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

The minutes of the eight hundredth regular meeting of the Council, held on the fourteenth day of July, 1952, were approved as written.

Mr. Robert W. Biglin, 17525 S. E. Valley View Road, came before the Council and stated that he was in charge of a National Guard Unit which meets in the Armory in Portland and that, due to over-crowded conditions there, he was seeking a location where there could be built temporary quarters to house this unit, with the possibility of the temporary quarters becoming a permanent armory, and requested the use of City property for this purpose. It was suggested that there was room for such a quarters on the site where the Sewage Disposal Plant is located. It was agreed that a letter requesting that such temporary armory for Battery A of the 722nd Anti Aircraft Artillery Battalion, be written to Thomas E. Rilea, Adj. Gen. at Salem, Oregon.

There was discussion with regard to Civil Defense materials now available through Government purchase. One item which will be necessary for the Fire Department is fire hose. It was moved by Mullan and seconded by Klein that the City approve the purchase of the better quality of hose (90¢). Motion carried and so ordered.

There was discussion on the matter of purchasing turn-out suits for the Fire Department. It was agreed by the Council that the City purchase the suits but that the order for same be held until after August 1, thereby giving the new Fire Chief an opportunity to select the outfits.
