MEETING OF JULY 14, 1958

924th MEETING

The nine hundred twenty-fourth regular meeting of the Council was held on the fourteenth day of July, 1958

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein; Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Clerk Martin.

Manager Burdick reported that the Sewer extension in Harrison Street east of 42nd Street was completed and presented the Engineer's final report on same. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Roberts that the Engineer's report be accepted and that the Contractor be paid \$1584.00 as recommended. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 724 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Klein that Ordinance No. 724 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 724 AN ORDINANCE declaring the assessment for the construction of a sanitary sewer along Harrison Street, east of 42nd Street, a distance of 500 feet, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result: Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 724 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Manager Burdick presented the Engineer's report of work now completed on 35th Street curb and sidewalks and stated that the improvement was progressing satisfactorily. It was moved by Clay and seconded by Roberts that the Engineer's report of work to date be accepted and that the Contractor be paid for the work completed less 10% in the amount of \$4472.60 as recommended. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Burdick read a letter in which there was a complaint of no buss service to Milwaukie on Sunday.

Manager Burdick reported that he had had complaints of rat infestation in Durst's Addition. The Council agreed that this was a problem which should be cared for by the occupants of the area.

Attorney Sheldahl reported that the case of Kampf vs City of Milwaukie will come up for hearing in September.

Mayor Mullan announced that he had appointed Ernest Aebi to serve on the Planning Commission, in the place of James Swaggerty, resigned.

A group of citizens from Ardenwald were present and presented a petition, signed by ninety-one resident property owners, requesting that sewers be constructed in the area recently annexed to the City. It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Clay that the necessary steps be taken to construct sewers and sewer trunk line to care for Ardenwald Cole Addition and Walnut Park Addition. Motion carried.
