MEETING OF JULY 28, 1952

Council Chambers

801st MEETING

The eight hundred first regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-eighth day of July, 1952.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

The minutes of the eight hundredth regular meeting of the Council, held on the fourteenth day of July, 1952, were approved as written.

Mr. Robert W. Biglin, 17525 S. E. Valley View Road, came before the Council and stated that he was in charge of a National Guard Unit which meets in the Armory in Portland and that, due to over-crowded conditions there, he was seeking a location where there could be built temporary quarters to house this unit, with the possibility of the temporary quarters becoming a permanent armory, and requested the use of City property for this purpose. It was suggested that there was room for such a quarters on the site where the Sewage Disposal Plant is located. It was agreed that a letter requesting that such temporary armory for Battery A of the 722nd Anti Aircraft Artillery Battalion, be written to Thomas L. Rilea, Adj. Gen. at Salem, Oregon.

There was discussion with regard to Civil Defense materials now available through Government purchase. One item which will be necessary for the Fire Department is fire hose. It was moved by Mullan and seconded by Klein that the City approve the purchase of the better quality of hose (90¢). Motion carried and so ordered.

There was discussion on the matter of purchasing turn-out suits for the Fire Department. It was agreed by the Council that the City purchase the suits but that the order for same be held until after August 1, thereby giving the new Fire Chief an opportunity to select the outfits.

Meeting of July 28, 1952 - Cont.

Acting Manager Sperr reported that property owners along Madison Street in Durst's Addition, had requested that the street be improved. The Council approved Manager Sperr's going ahead and having an Engineer's estimate of cost made for this project.

Acting Manager Sperr reported the progress being made on the Harrison Street sewer, between 21st and 23rd Streets, also the progress being made on the Penzance Street sewer and street improvements as well as the Monroe Street improvements.

The Council requested Acting Manager Sperr to get an estimated cost of paving Washington Street from the present pavement to Elmer Street and Elmer Street from Washington Street to Oak Street.

The Manager pro tem suggested that on account of complaint being made by certain property owners on the East side of 27th Street, to the parking being cut back on that side of the street, that the parking be taken out along that side of the street only where consent had been given, that a wide radius be cut at the East side of the intersection of 27th and Washington Streets, at the north-west intersection of 27th and Willard streets and at the north-west intersection of 27th and Lake Road.

Mr. Fred Juanett, No. 1 Riverway Lane appeared before the Council and requested that water be piped to his property. The Council, after investigation, agreed that water could be piped along public thoroughfare but that any pipe along Riverway Lane would have to be laid by property Owners as Riverway Lane is a private roadway.

It was moved by Mullan and seconded by Klein that John Jersey be paid ny warrant for the laying of Penzance Street Sewer when the Engineer approves the work and that an ordinance be prepared for the assessment of the cost of said sewer. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Norbeck that the City purchase gasoline from Richfield Oil (Milliken and Servas) under an agreement until December 31, 1952. Motion carried and so ordered.

On motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.

MEETING OF AUGUST 11, 1952

Council Chambers

802nd MEETING

The eight hundred and second regular meeting of the Council was held on the eleventh day of August 1952.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Taylor, Mullan, Klein and Norbeck; Attorney Kirkpatrick and Recorder Martin.

Mr. D. A. Mallory, 2126 Monroe St. and Mr. J. Harbacheck, 2136 Monroe Street, came before the Council and made complaint of the house across the street from their property and asked that it be removed immediately. It was reported that the house was presently being emptied preparatory to its removal and that it would be superfluous to issue orders for this work to be done.

Lt. Col. I. D. Miller, Battalion Commander, 722nd Anti Aircraft Artillery Group and Captain Biglin, of the same group before the Council and requested that the Council state what they (Council) could do with regard
