Street according to his proposal therefor. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to execute a contract on behalf of the City with C. H. Counsell for the improvement of 35th. Street. The following resolution was read and upon motion duly made and carried, was unanimously adopted as read:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF MILWAUKIE; That Willard Street from 25th. Street to the center line of 27th. Street, as surveyed by the City Engineer, be and the same is hereby declared extended, opened, laid out and established as a City Street of Milwaukie, Oregon.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JULY 8TH. 1929.

The three hundred twenty eighth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 8th. day of July, 1929, Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Earl, Dean and Dell, Recorder Mathews, Marshal Keck and Treasurer Wiseman. The minutes of the three hundred twenty-seventh regular meeting of the Council held on the 10th. day of June, 1929, were read and approved as read. A petition for the improvement of Willard Street was read, and the Council deeming it expedient and necessary that Willard Street be improved as petitioned, upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of said Willard Street as petitioned for, and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof.

The City Engineer thereafter filed with the Recorder plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of Willard Street as petitioned for, together with an estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, and said plans, specifications and estimates being satisfactory to the Council, the following resolution was read and unanimously adopted as read:

4-1929 RESOLUTION AND NOTICE OF THE IMPROVEMENT OF WILLARD STREET FROM THE WEST LINE OF LOT 3, BLOCK 3, YOUNG'S ADDITION TO MILWAUKIE, EASTERLY TO THE WEST LINE OF 27TH. STREET.

WHEREAS, pursuant to an order of the Council of Milwaukie, Oregon, heretofore made, the City Engineer has filed his report and filed in the office of the Recorder of Milwaukie, Oregon, plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of Willard Street from the west line of Lot 3, Block 3m Young's Addition to Milwaukie, easterly to the west line of 27th. Street, in Milwaukie, Oregon, according to the petition therefor and heretofore filed with the Recorder, together with an estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, and

WHEREAS, said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory to the Council of Milwaukie, Oregon, now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that said plans, specifications and estimates be and the same are hereby adopted and approved, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that it is the purpose and intention of Milwaukie by its Council to make said improvement described as follows, to-wit:

1. By grading said street the full width to the established grade.
2. By constructing a crushed gravel roadway the full width of said street from the west line of Lot 3, Block 3, Young's Addition to the west line of 25th. Street, six inches in depth, and by constructing an eighteen foot crushed gravel roadway six inches in depth in the center of said street from the west line of 25th. Street easterly to the west line of 27th. Street,
3. By constructing two course concrete sidewalks four feet wide and four inches thick and 16 inch curbs on both sides of said street from the west line of Lot 3, Block 3, Young's Addition to the west line of 25th. Street.
4. By providing necessary drainage and constructing the necessary crosswalks.

All work to be done in strict accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore filed with the Recorder of Milwaukie, Oregon, and approved by this resolution.

Remonstrances against said improvement may be filed in writing with the Recorder of Milwaukie, on or before ten days from the 10th. day of July, 1929.

The Recorder is hereby directed to cause this Notice and Resolution to be posted as required by the Charter of Milwaukie, Oregon. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to advertise in the Daily Journal of Commerce for bids for the improvement of Jefferson, the bids to be opened by the Council of the 29th. day of July, 1929. The report of the City Treasurer was read and ordered placed on file. Upon motion duly made and carried, the request of the City Treasurer for a vacation for a period of 15 days with pay was granted. The resignation of W. E. Kelso as Water and Street Supt. to take effect on the 1st day of August, 1929, was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the resignation of Mr. Kelso was accepted. A letter from Edith Hazen in regard to the resignation of Mr. Kelso was read and placed on the table. The application of Mr. J. F. Elliott for the position of Water, Street and Sewer Supt. was read and upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Elliott was employed as Water, Street and Sewer Supt.

A communication from the East Milwaukie Progressive Club complimenting the Council for its action in regard to stopping the sale of cigarettes to minors was read and ordered placed on file.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to write Mr. W. E. Kelso a letter expressing the appreciation of the Council of his work as Water Supt.

Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Leo Shindler was elected President of the Council.
