After considerable discussion it was moved by Burdick and seconded by Dell that the City Engineer, Water Superintendent and Recorder prepare an application to the Federal Government for a grant on a project to replace worn out water mains and install standard fire hydrants on the new water lines where deemed necessary. Motion carried and so ordered.

Water superintendent Bevington submitted a request that an extension of the S.E.R.A. water meter repair project be secured. It was moved by Walsh and seconded by Burdick that an application for such an extension be authorized. Motion carried and so ordered.

Upon motion duly made and carried the meeting was adjourned.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, JULY 8, 1935

The four hundred second regular meeting of the Council was held on the 8th day of July, 1935.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders;
Present: Mayor Sanders; Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Shrock and Walsh;
Water Superintendent Bevington; Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the four hundredth and four hundred first regular meetings were each read and were each approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.
The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

A communication from the Hawley Pulp & Paper Co. requesting that it be allowed to keep the debris of its burned mill in status quo pending the trial of its lawsuit with the insureis of the mill was read. No action was taken on the request.

James Roberts appeared and requested a year's lease on the old East Milwaukie Fire Hall for the purpose of operating a cannery therein. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Burdick that the Mayor and Recorder be authorized to execute a lease leasing the old East Milwaukie Fire Hall to James Roberts for a period of one year from July 15, 1935 at a monthly rental of \$5.00 per month and providing that the lessee pay for all lights, water, and gas and insure the property against fire to the extent of \$200.00. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. J.F. Maurer appeared and offered to sell the city its wood supply for the ensuing year. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Burdick that the matter be layed on the table until the first meeting in August.

The Recorder Stated that the former owner, R. SPRAGUE, of lot 26, block 9, Quincy Addition had offered to pay \$25.00 in full payment of all liens against the property. It was developed that the City had not recorded its deed until several years after the property had been sold and that Mr. SPRAGUE had paid the taxes during that period and had just discovered that the City had title to the property. It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Walsh that if Mr. SPRAGUE paid \$25.00 within 10 days that the Mayor and Recorder be authorized to deed the property back to him. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder read three ordinances relative to peddlers, hawkers and occupations. The matter was layed on the table until the next meeting.

The following bills were read and it was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dell that the Recorder issue warrants for the same. Motion carried and so ordered.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, JULY 22, 1935

The four hundred third regular meeting of the Council was held on the 22nd day of July, 1935.

After considerable discussion it was moved by Shrock and seconded by Burdick that the Engineer, Water Superintendent and Recorder make application to the Works Progress Administration for a project or projects covering the replacement of certain water mains and installation of additional fire hydrants. Motion carried and so ordered.

The matter of a city licensing ordinance was taken up for consideration. After considerable discussion it was moved by Shrock and seconded by Burdick that the Recorder post the nuisance ordinance number 352 and that the matter of a licensing ordinance be layed on the table until the next meeting. Motion carried and so ordered.

The question of doing away with slot machines was taken up for discussion. No action was taken.

The Fire Chief requested authority to purchase a tarpaulin. The request was denied.

The Water Superintendent requested authority to purchase meter supplies to the value of \$21.00. It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Walsh that the authority be granted. Motion carried and so ordered.
