

MEETING OF JUNE 24, 1940

The five hundred fifteenth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 24th day of June, 1940.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts, Councilmen Gillem, Kirkpatrick, Mourer, Rivers and Rudder; Water Superintendent Bevington, Fire Chief Lewellyn, Marshal Rigdon, and Recorder Adams.

The expiration of the franchise of the Portland Gas & Coke Co. was mentioned by the Recorder. Mayor Roberts appointed Jarvis Thompson, Charles Walden, and Councilmen Kirkpatrick and Rivers as a committee to negotiate with representatives of the Gas Company relative to the term of a new franchise.

It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Rivers that during July and August, 1940, the following sprinkling regulations shall be observed between the hours of 5.00 P. M. and 10:00 P. M. of each day.

Residents of Ward One shall sprinkle on odd-numbered days only.

Residents of Ward Two shall sprinkle on even-numbered days only.

Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Rivers that Charles Counsel be employed to oil Railroad Avenue south of Monroe Street to the city limits for a sum not to exceed \$425. Motion carried and so ordered.

MEETING OF JULY 8, 1940

The five hundred sixteenth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 8th day of July, 1940.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts. Present: Mayor Roberts, Councilmen Gillem, Kirkpatrick, Mourer, Rivers and Rudder, Water Superintendent Bevington, Fire Chief Lewellyn, and Marshal Rigdon.

The minutes of the five hundred fourteenth and five hundred fifteenth regular meetings of the Council, held respectively on the 10th and 24th days of June, 1940, were each read and were each approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

MEETING OF JULY 22, 1940

The five hundred seventeenth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 22nd day of July, 1940.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts. Present. Mayor Roberts, Councilmen Gillem, Kirkpatrick, Mourer, Rivers and Rudder; Water Superintendent Bevington, Fire Chief Lewellyn, Marshal Rigdon and Recorder Adams.

The Librarian's report for the six months ending June 30, 1940, was read and ordered filed.

The Recorder read the resignation of Lloyd Terrill as City Engineer. It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Rudder that the resignation be accepted. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder reported that he was unable to get the owners of the rightaway for the proposed extension of Sellwood Street from Thirtieth Street to Twenty-seventh Street to donate the necessary property. Mayor Roberts announced the appointment of Lloyd Cooley, J. C. Peters, Clarence Rudder and J. F. Mourer as a committee to see what could be done to finance the procurement of the proposed rightaway.
