the Mayor and Recorder be directed to sign the same, and that the permit be issued in accordance with the agreement. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Kelsey stated that the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Co. had contacted him and he expected to be able to make a report as to what could be done about the Fire Call telephones in Kellogg Park

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Roberts that Mr. H.A. Burbank be allowed two weeks vacation. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Nelson that Wm. Hofmann be allowed two weeks vacation with pay. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Kelsey announced that the sewer district being formed south of Milwaukie had enough signers to put the Sewage Disposal proposal on the ballots in November and that they looked with favor upon Milwaukie joining with them in building a disposal plant.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Roberts that the City Hall chairs be loaned to the Milwaukie Masonic Lodge, Saturday June 29, 1946. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Hamlin that the Auditor Treasurer Financial report be accepted as presented. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Nelson that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.

MEETING OF JULY 8, 1946

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

656th MEETING

The six hundred fifth sixth regular meeting of the Council was held on the eighth day of July 1946.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Hamlin, Roberts Nelson and Rowe; Manager Kelsey, Water Superintendent Hofmann, Officer Burbank and Recorder Martin. Absent: Attorney Kirkpatrick, Treasurer Walcott and Fire Chief Lewellyn.

The minutes of the six hundred fifty-fifth regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-fourth day of June, 1946 were read and approved as read.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Sperr that the Townsend Club be permitted to meet in the basement of the City Hall during July and August, and that they pay \$2.00 per meeting for operative costs. Motion carried and so ordered.

Two bids were opened for the grading and graveling of 35th Street and 37th Street. One of the bidders, George Abraham did not qualify as his bids were not accompanied by certified check.

Bids presented by Frank Lyons & Co. were as follows: For the grading and graveling of 37th Street from Harvey Avenue to King Street, in accordance with the specifications set forth by the Engineer \$2,441.25. For the grading and graveling of 35th Street, south of Wister Street a distance of 600 linear feet, in accordance with the specifications set forth by the Engineer, \$1,400.00 It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Rowe that since the bids were higher than the Engineer's estimated cost, that they be held until Mr. Kelsey could contact the property owners along the streets and ascertain if they were willing to pay the difference in cash. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Kelsey reported that Mr. Baker, of the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph Co., had contacted him and stated that after reviewing the matter of the telephone rate for the fire call telephones in Kellogg Park, he could find no way to reduce the bill. It was decided that Mr. Fred Roberts should lay the matter before the Board of Commissioners of the Housing Authority of the County of Clackamas.

A petition, over eighteen signatures, requesting that street lights be placed on Harvey Avenue, was read. Manager Kelsey was requested to check the matter and report at the next meeting of the Council.

A petition, presented by Mrs. Stella Shove, protesting the sign board advertising of alcoholic beverages in Milwaukie, was read. It was decided that a letter be written to Mrs. Shove explaining that the Council has no control over the type of advertising placed on bill boards.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Roberts that these two petitions be filed. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Hamlin that the insurance for the City Hall be renewed with C.F. Richardson. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Roberts that Ordinance No. 485 be read by title only for its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 485 AN ORDINANCE providing for the construction of a sewer on 30th Street from the present sewer on Washington Street where the same intersects the center line of 30th Street; thence southerly along said 30th Street to the northerly line of a tract of land known as the Hoesly Tract, being also the southerly terminus of said 30th Street; and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read by title only and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Sperr, Roberts, Nelson, Hamlin and Rowe. Nays. None. Ordinance Number 485 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Nelson that Ordinance 486 be read by title only for its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 486 AN ORDINANCE providing for the construction of a sewer on Monroe Street from a point in the center line of Monroe Street S. 80 deg. 38' W. 14.00 feet distant from the north-easterly boundary of 29th Street, in Milwaukie, Oregon; thence run-
