MEETING OF JULY 9, 1945

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

632nd MEETING

The six hundred thirty-second regular meeting of the Council was held on the ninth day of July, 1945.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Hamlin, Nelson, Roberts and Rowe; Attorney Kirkpatrick, Water Superintendent Counsell, Officer Burbank and Recorder Martin. Absent: Treasurer Walcott and Fire Chief Lewellyn.

The minutes of the six hundred thirty-first regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-sixth day of June, 1945, were read and approved as read.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-ninth day of June, 1945, were read and approved as read.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the second day of July, 1945, were read and approved as read.

Mr. Sperr reported that Mr. Bolander would operate a taxi and not a "for hire" car, and would be willing to publish his rates. *Taxi*

Mr. C. Renard came before the Council on behalf of Company C. 4th Battalion, State Guard, and ask that they be permitted to meet in the basement of the City Hall. Mr. Renard stated that if the Guard met in the basement they would require a locker room for their equipment. It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Hamlin that Company "C" 4th Battalion, State Guard have use of the basement room for their meetings, once each week. Motion carried and so ordered.

Officer Burbank brought to the attention of the Council several items of matters which he has been checking, among which was the marquee, which was still fastened to the building on Monroe and Main Sts. which had been demolished by fire, and was a hazard to pedestrians. The different reports were turned over to the Police Commissioner who was to use his judgment in their disposition.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Roberts that the Mayor and Recorder be authorized to issue a deed to George H. and Edith M. Buckle for Lots 19-20-21-22 and 23 Block 73 Minthorn Addition, to replace a deed made to the same parties on June 17, 1943. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Nelson gave a complete report of the progress made with regard to the new well. He stated that Mr. Green, from John Cunningham and Associates, Consulting Engineers, had laid out the location for the well and would help set up bids for the pump after the digging was completed. He stated that Mr. Green had said that a 12 inch well would be adequate for the City's needs for some time to come and that there could be another well drilled on the City property at 40th and Harvey Sts. Mr. Green suggested that a booster pump in the down-town area should take care of the Island district.

633rd MEETING

The six hundred thirty-third regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-third day of July, 1945.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Hamlin, Nelson, Roberts and Rowe. Attorney Kirkpatrick, Treasurer Walcott, Officer Burbank, Captain Stevens and Recorder Martin. Absent: Water Superintendent Counsell and Fire Chief Lewellyn.

The minutes of the six hundred thirty-second regular meeting of the Council held on the ninth day of July, 1945, were read and approved as read.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Rowe that the Recorder notify, by letter, the owners of the building on Lot 8 Block 16 Milwaukie, to remove the marquee and such other parts of the building that constitute a dangerous hazard. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. M. J. Walsh, reported that the committee on zoning the City were working out plans and expected to have these plans ready to lay before the Council in the near future. It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Nelson that the Zoning Committee be authorized to have a map of the City made for their use. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Rowe that the Mayor and Recorder be authorized to sign an agreement with the Housing Authority of the County of Clackamas, for the loan of their fire fighting apparatus for one year. Motion carried and so ordered.
