COUNCIL CHAMBERS, JULY, 13, 1936

The four hundred twenty-third regular meeting of the Council was held on the 13th day of July, 1936. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders.

Present: Mayor Sanders, Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh and Wills; Water Superintendent Bevington; Marshal Riley, Fire Chief Lewellyn, and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the four hundred twenty-first regular meeting of the Council and the four hundred twenty-second regular meeting of the Council held respectively on the 8th and 22nd day of June 1936 and of the special meeting of the Council held on the 17th day of June, 1936 were each read and were each approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Recorder read five initiative petitions requesting the calling of a special election to be held on August 3, 1936 for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Milwaukie for their acceptance or rejection of a proposal to repeal the "Well Water Amendment". The Recorder read the certificate of the County Clerk, who had checked the names on the petitions, to the effect that there were 832 legal voters in Milwaukie and that the petitions contained 176 genuine names. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dell that the Recorder prepare and post an ordinance calling for a special election to be held August 3rd, 1936 for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Milwaukie the question of whether the "Well Water Amendment" should be repealed. Motion carried and so ordered.
