Ordinance Number 751 AN ORDINANCE providing for the construction of a sanitary sewer along Wake Street from its intersection with 32nd Street to its easterly terminus and for the construction of sewer laterals from said sanitary sewer to the property line where said laterals are requested, directing the City Manager to give notice inviting proposals therefor and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Clay, Mortensen, Sedgwick and Howard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 751 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

## MEETING OF JULY 13, 1959

## 936th MEETING

The nine hundred thirty-sixth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the thirteenth day of July, 1959.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Clay.

Present: Mayor Clay; Councilmen Mortensen, Sedgwick and Howard; Manager Mullan, Consultant Burdick and Clerk Martin.

The minutes of the nine hundred thirty-fifth regular meeting of the Council, held on the eight day of June, 1959, were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the ninth day of June 1959, were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the fifteenth day of June, 1959, were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the sixteenth day of June, 1959, were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the twentieth day of June, 1959, were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the thirtieth day of June, were approved as written.

Applications for annexation of territories in Maplecrest, Garner Acres, Plimpton Tracts, Engle Addition and Marchbanks Addition were laid before the Council.

Ordinance Number 752 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Sedgwick that Ordinance Number 752 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

As this was the time set for the hearing on the assessment for the Ardenwald "Area A" sewers and trunk line sewers, the Mayor opened the hearing and called for protests to the same.

Protest petitions, signed by the owners of twenty-four parcels of property in Walnut Park and Floss Acres, objecting to the \$75.00 per lateral fee for installation of laterals from the sanitary sewers to the property lines, were read.

There were nineteen letters of protest read, of which a large majority were objecting to the square foot assessment for the trunk line sewers. A majority of the protests for this charge, were from owners of properties assessed for the trunk line where no sewers were constructed along their streets. It was explained to them that if and when the sewers were laid to their properties, the same would flow into the trunk lines for which they were now assessed, and that the properties would be served, and that therefore the present assessment was a just assessment.

The Mayor announced that the Council would proceed with business at hand before closing the hearing.

Mr. John Shields, 3907 Lake Road, came before the Council and made inquiry as to why the six inch water main in Lake Road could not be extended to his property at this time. Mr. Shields was assured by the City Manager that when and if it was shown that six inch water main to his property was necessary and that the same would serve enough users to assure a reasonable return of the investment cost of the extension, the City would be willing to enlarge the pipe line.

Mr. Edward Lee Jr. came before the Council and stated that he would like to construct his own sidewalk along 33rd Street, at his property, and requested that he be permitted to pour the curb and sidewalk without a parking area. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Howard that this matter be referred to the City Manager. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Howard and seconded by Mortensen that the following Resolution be adopted.

## RESOLUTION NUMBER 14-1959

WHEREAS, by Resolution of the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, No. 13-1959, duly adopted on the 8th day of June, 1959, the said City Council did declare its intention to appoint a new City Manager to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of former City Manager Earl Burdick; and

WHEREAS, a period of more than four weeks has now elapsed since the date of the adoption of the said Resolution; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has now decided and determined to appoint Leonard B. Mullan as City Manager of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon;


NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED That Leonard B. Mullan be and he hereby is appointed City Manager of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for an indefinite term subject to removal at the pleasure of a majority of the City Council.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that before entering upon his duties as such City Manager he shall file with the Mayor an official bond in the sum of \$5000.00 for the faithful performance of his duties as such, the premium of said bond to be paid by the City.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said Leonard B. Mullan shall receive as compensation for his services as City Manager of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, the sum of \$450.00 per month.

Ordinance Number 752, AN ORDINANCE providing for the procedure, without election, to annex certain territories, contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, fixing a day for public hearing before the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the question of such annexation, directing publication of notice of such hearing, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Clay, Mortensen, Sedgwick and Howard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 752 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 753, AN ORDINANCE declaring the assessment for the construction of sanitary sewers along certain streets in Ardenwald and 36th Street and for the construction of a trunk line sewer along Roswell Avenue, the easterly right-of-way line of the Southern Pacific Company, Stubb and Short Streets, and for the construction of sewer laterals from the sanitary sewers to the property lines, where the same are requested, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Clay, Mortensen, Sedgwick and Howard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 753 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.
