

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JULY 14TH. 1930.

The three hundred fortieth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 14th. day of July, 1930. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Sanders, Dell, Shindler and Dean, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred thirty-ninth regular meeting of the Council held on the 9th. day of June, 1930, were read and approved as read. The Committee appointed to see the S. F. Company in regard to installing caution signs in Milwaukie reported that they had not been able to take the matter up with the Company yet. Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that the City Truck be insured against both property and personal damages. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to draw a warrant against the emergency fund for \$50.00 in favor of C. F. Dean for advertising Milwaukie at the Salmon River Cutoff pageant ~~to be held on~~ the 19th. day of July, 1930. Prof. Rowe was present and requested the use of the upstairs of the City Hall. The matter was taken under advisement until the next regular meeting of the Council. The City Engineer presented plans and specifications and estimates of the cost of the straightening of Harrison Street at 23rd. Street. The plans, specifications and estimates being satisfactory upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to advertise for bids for the improvement, the bids to be opened at the next regular meeting of the Council to be held on the 11th. day of August, 1930.

A communication from G. C. Pelton requesting the Council to release the east 15 feet of Lot 3, Block 3, Young's Addition, upon the payment of its portion of the cost of Willard Street, was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to enter a release on the Bond Lien Docket of the east 15 feet of Lot 3, Block 3, Young's Addition, upon the payment of its portion of the cost of Willard Street improvement.

Mr. Dahlman was present and asked the Council for a free dance permit for the Milwaukie Band for Sunday the 20th. day of July, 1930. Upon motion duly made and carried, the request was granted.
