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Town Hall, Milwaukie, Oregon, July 16th. 1920.

An adjourned meeting of the two hundred twentieth regular meeting of the Council was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, Councilmen, Miller, Hart and Counsell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. There being no bids received for the improvement of 24th. Street, the petitioners for the improvement of said Street withdrew their petition with the understanding that they would present a new petition for the improvement of said street later on. Whereupon the Council, upon motion duly made and carried, rescinded and avoided all proceedings for the improvement of 24th. Street.

A petition of property owners whose property abuts on 32nd. Street, for the improvement of said street was read and ordered placed on file.

The Council deeming it necessary that said street be improved as petitioned for, upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specifications for said improvement, and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof. The City Engineer filed with the recorder and presented to the Council plans and specifications and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof of the improvement of 32nd. Street, as petitioned for, and said plans, specifications and estimates being satisfactory to the Council, the following resolution and notice was read and upon motion duly made and carried, was adopted as read:

Resolution and Notice for the Improvement of 32nd. street in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon.

Whereas, pursuant to an order of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, heretofore made, the City Engineer has filed his report, and filed in the office of the recorder of said Town plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of 32nd. street, according to the petition heretofore filed, together with an estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, and whereas, said plans, specifications and estimates are satisfactory to the Council of the Town of Milwaukie:

THHEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that said plans, specifications and estimates be and the same are hereby approved and adopted: AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the purpose and intention of the Town of Milwaukie by its Council to make said improvements, being described as follows, to-wit:

(1) That said street be improved from the South line of Elmer Street to the North line of Wister Street.

(2) The Street shall be brought to a grade as established and a minimum of 4 cubic feet per lineal foot of pit-run gravel shall be placed in the center of the street for a space of 8 feet in width. The gravel to be applied under the supervision and direction of the City Engineer.

(3) The Engineer shall set all grade stakes that are necessary and as are customary for the putting in of sidewalks and curbs. The laying of sidewalks to be optional with the individual property owner and if so laid shall be at said property owners expense and may be laid by himself or a contractor. Sidewalks to be cement, 4 feet in width and not less than 4 inches thick, to be laid at a distance of 18 inches from the property line. Curbs where put in shall be 18 inches deep, 8 inches on bottom and 6 inches on the top, and the face of the same shall be 14 feet from the property line. All of said work to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore filed with the Recorder of Milwaukie and approved by this resolution. Remonstrances against said improvement may be filed in writing with the Recorder of said Town on or before ten days from the 16th day of July, 1920.

The Town Recorder is hereby directed to cause this Resolution and Notice to be posted as required by the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon. No further business coming before the meeting, upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.

A special meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, Councilmen, Miller, Counsell and Hart, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. The Mayor stated the meeting was called for the purpose of considering the petition for the improvement of 24th. Street.

A petition of the property owners along 24th. Street for the improvement of the same was read and ordered placed on file, and the Council deeming necessary that said street be improved as petitioned for, upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and Specifications for said improvement and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof. The City Engineer filed with the recorder and presented to the Council plans and specifications for the improvement of 24th. Street together with an estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof as petitioned for, and said plans and specifications and estimates being satisfactory to the Council, the following resolution and notice was read and upon motion duly made and
