The four hundred ninety-fourth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 14th day of August, 1939.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Burdick.

The minutes of the four hundred ninety-second and four hundred ninety-third regular meetings of the Council held respectively on the 10th and 24th days of July, 1939 were each read and were each approved as read.
