

Ordinance Number 369 entitled: "An Ordinance providing for a special election to be held on the 3rd day of August, 1936 for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Milwaukee for their acceptance or rejection a proposal to repeal Section 85 of the Charter of Milwaukee, known as the Well Water Amendment, providing further a designation of the polling places, judges, and clerks of election, and declaring an emergency" was taken up for consideration and read for the first time. A communication from Charles F. Sievers, an attorney, in which stated that an election held on August 3rd would not be legal because of insufficient time to post notices of election was read. It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Wills that Ordinance Number 369 be layed on the table. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder recommended that the outstanding general obligation paving bonds and C. W. A. bonds be refunded in order that the City might materially reduce the six percent interest rate now payable on said bonds. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Walsh that the Recorder initiate and carry out proceedings looking towards the refunding of the general obligation paving bonds and C. W. A. bonds. Motion carried and so ordered.

X The Recorder reported that in the suit which he filed to quiet title to certain city property that in reference to Lots 12 & 13, Block 12, Quincy Addition the heirs of the Estate of Mary Pfeifer, deceased had offered to deed their interest for the sum of \$10.00 per lot. The Recorder stated that it would cost more than that amount to get service on the heirs of the Estate as they were scattered in different states in the East and Middle West. It was moved by Walsh and seconded by Dell that the Recorder be authorized to pay \$20.00 to the heirs of the estate Mary Pfeifer for a deed conveying all their interest in Lots 12 and 13, Block 12, Quincy Addition. Motion carried and so ordered. Upon motion duly made and carried the meeting was adjourned.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL, JULY 27, 1936

The four hundred twenty-fourth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 27th day of July, 1936. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders.

Present: Mayor Sanders; Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh and Wills; Fire Chief Lewellyn; Water Superintendent Bevington; Marshal Riley; and Recorder Adams.

The Recorder opened and read the following sealed bids for Milwaukee Fire Equipment Bonds:

1. Bid By Baker Fordyce and Co. for all or none \$7,500, Milwaukee Fire Equipment Bonds at 100.84 and accrued interest, said bonds bearing interest at 3%, accompanied by a certified check for \$150.00
2. Bid by Universal Bond & Mortgage Corporation for all or none \$7,500.00, Milwaukee Fire Equipment Bonds as follows:
Bonds 1 to 5, inclusive - 100.18 bearing 3% interest
Bonds 6 to 15, inclusive - 100.18 bearing 2 3/4% interest
plus accrued interest, accompanied by a certified check of \$150.00.
3. Bid by Tripp and McClearey for all or none \$7,500.00, Milwaukee Fire Equipment Bonds at 100.41 and accrued interest, said bonds bearing interest at 2 3/4%, accompanied by a certified check for \$150.00
4. Bid by E. M. Adams & Co. for all or none \$7,500.00 Milwaukee Fire Equipment Bonds at 100.23 and accrued interest, said bonds bearing interest at 3 1/2%, accompanied by a certified check for \$150.00

It was moved by Walsh and seconded by Wills that the Bid of Tripp and McClearey, Inc. be accepted and that the Recorder deliver the bonds and receive payment therefor on behalf of Milwaukee. The roll call on the motion being taken the following result was had:

Ayes: Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh and Wills
Nays: None.

Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Dell that the Mayor be authorized and directed to execute a contract of rental of a pump from the Worthington Company, Inc. Such contract to provide for the installation of a pump according to the bid of the Worthington Company, Inc. of June 22, 1936; a rental of \$500.00 for the period dating from August 17th to November 3rd, 1936 and providing that the pump will be purchased

for a total sum of \$2291.81 if the voters of Milwaukee do not disapprove Well Water on election on November 3rd. The \$500.00 paid as rental to apply on the purchase price if a purchase is made. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Wills that the following be appointed to the Milwaukee Library Board. Mrs. R. B. Eckenberger, Miss Jessie H. Millard; Mrs. E. B. Stanley; Mrs. Edgar Piper; Mrs. E. W. Kirkpatrick; Mr. J. Earl Jones; and Mr. S. L. Burton. Motion Carried and so ordered.

An application by Boyd Motors, Inc. for the establishment of a twenty foot loading zone in front of the premises occupied by them on Front Street was read. It was moved by Wills and seconded by Burdick that the request be granted. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dell that the County Clerk be notified to resume registration of voters residing in Milwaukee at once. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Burdick that the roadway curves at the intersections of Elmer and Oak Streets and Elmer and Washington Streets be widened. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder reported that he had received the following offers for the following lots:

Offer of Helen Albin of \$55.20 for lots 35 and 36, Block 41, Minthorn Addition.

Offer of Sam Riley of \$182.00 for lots 12 and 13, Block 11, Quincy Addition.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Dell that the offers be accepted and that the Mayor and Recorder be authorized and directed to issue deeds to the respective offerors in exchange for the sums specified. Motion carried and so ordered.

The application of Safeways, Inc. for a temporary building permit was received and referred to the Fire Chief.

A request of Safeways, Inc. for a State Wine License application endorsement was read. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Burdick that consideration of the matter be indefinitely postponed. Motion carried and so ordered.

Fire Chief Lewellyn requested that the City purchase eight hundred feet of fire hose. It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Dell that the Mayor be authorized and directed to contract for the purchase of 800 feet of fire hose at \$1.20 per foot, 500 feet to be paid for in cash the balance to be paid for on or before March 1, 1937. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Dell that the Water Superintendent be authorized to purchase all pipe fittings necessary for the installation of a pump in the twelve inch water well. Motion carried and so ordered.

Upon motion duly made and carried the meeting was adjourned.
