TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JULY 28TH 1913.

A call meeting of the one hundred thirty-sixth (136) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, Councilmen, Mitchell, Davis, King, Counsell and Albee, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. The proposal of the Southern Pacific Co., to accept \$440.00 as damages for the extension of Laurel through its property was read and ordered placed on file. Moved and seconded that the Mayor appoint a second viewer to assess benefits and damages of the extension of Laurel Avenue. Carried.

The plans and specifications for the improvement of Monroe and De Witt Streets were taken up for consideration and the same being satisfactory to the Council, upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Davis and carried, the following resolutions were adopted:

 RESOLUTION AND NOTICE FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF MONROE STREET IN THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON.

WHEREAS, pursuant to an order of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, heretofore made, the City Engineer has filed his report, and filed in the office of the Recorder of said Town of Milwaukie, plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of Monroe Street according to the petition heretofore filed, together with an estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof.

AND WHEREAS, said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory to the Council of the Town of Milwaukie:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that said plans, specifications and estimates be and the same are hereby adopted and approved, AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the purpose and intention of the Town of Milwaukie by its Town Council to make said improvements, being described as follows, to-wit:

That the said Street shall be improved from Main Street on the West to Shindler Street or Patton Avenue on the East by grading the street to the established grade, provided, however, that no cut shall exceed four (4) feet in depth and that no fill shall exceed two (2) feet in height unless sufficient dirt for a greater desired fill should be available from said cuts, by constructing concrete curbs and cement sidewalks from Main Street to Irving Street to correspond with the concrete curbs and cement sidewalks already laid on Monroe Street between Front Street and Main Street; by constructing concrete curbs and cement sidewalks from Irving Street to Shindler Street or Patton Avenue, said walks to be one foot from property line and five feet in width including the curb; by constructing concrete cross walks, inlets, catch-basins, drains, headers and other incidentals to a proper improvement; by raising the bridge at Mr. Fisch's so that it will conform with the grade of the street, and by attaching to the

bridge a sidewalk for pedestrians; by macadamizing the street, which is to be seventy (70) feet wide from Main Street to Irving Street and to be macadamized the full length between curbs, and said street to be forty (40) feet wide from Irving Street to Shindler Street or Patton Avenue, and to be macadamized the full length of Twenty-eight (28) feet between curbs, as provided by the plans and specifications heretofore filed with the Recorder of Milwaukie and approved by this resolution.

The Town Recorder is hereby directed to cause this resolution and notice to be posted as required by the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon.

RESOLUTION AND NOTICE FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF DE WITT STREET IN THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON.

WHEREAS, pursuant to an order of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, heretofore made, the City Engineer has filed his report, and filed in the Office of the Recorder of said Town of Milwaukie plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of De Witt Street according to the petition heretofore filed, together with an estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof,

AND WHEREAS, said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory to the Council of The Town of Milwaukie:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the said plans, specifications and estimates be and the same are hereby adopted and approved, AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the purpose and intention of the Town of Milwaukie by its Town Council to make said improvements, being described as follows, to-wit:

That the said street shall be improved by grading the street to the established grade; by constructing wooden curbs and wooden sidewalks, said sidewalks to be four (4) feet wide and 18 inches from property line and to be laid on the East side of the street only; said street to be graded 30 feet wide from curb to curb, leaving a nine foot parking; by constructing wooden cross walks where needed, inlets, drains, gutters etc., and other incidentals to a proper improvement, as provided by the plans and specifications heretofore filed with the Recorder of Milwaukie and approved by this resolution.

The Town Recorder is hereby directed to cause this resolution and notice to be posted as required by the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon.

Upon motion duly made and carried Ordinance No. 90 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 90 passed the first reading. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 90 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell and Albee. Nays none. Ordinance No. 90 passed the second reading. Upon motion of Councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 90 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 90 passed the third and final reading.

The following bill were read and allowed by the Finance Committee, and upon motion duly carried, the recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:

A proposed ordinance granting a franchise to the Clackamas County Gas Company to lay gas main in the Town of Milwaukie was read, and councilman Mitchell was instructed to notify the Company to have a representative at the next council meeting.
