MEETING OF AUGUST 14, 1950

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

754th MEETING

The seven hundred fifty-fourth regular meeting of the Council was held on the fourteenth day of August, 1950.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Norbeck, Mullan and Frady; Attorney Kirkpatrick and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman Taylor.

The minutes of the 753rd regular meeting, held on the 24th day of July, 1950, were read and approved. The minutes of a special meeting, held on the eleventh day of August, were read and approved.

A recommendation from the Planning Commission that the Council grant permission to Jarvis Thompson to move the Schade house from 2035 Harrison Street to his property at 2416 Monroe was considered. It was shown that the property on which the house was to be placed was a large lot 280 feet deep by 72½ feet wide. That there would be at least a 12 foot driveway, that Mr. Thompson's residence was on the front of the property, that the house to be moved would be converted into apartments and that the property was in a multiple family zone. After considerable discussion on the matter the Council decided to view the property on the morrow and make a decision at that time.

The matter of the present width of Meek Street was discussed. It appeared that the street is only 20 feet wide, a portion of the street having been vacated with the vacation of the plat of Harvey's First Addition at the time the Government acquired the property for Hillside Park. It was moved by Frady and seconded by Mullan that the City request the United States through the Housing Authority of Clackamas County to give 20 feet along the north side of Meek Street from 32nd Street to the railroad right-of-way for street purposes. The motion was carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Norbeck and seconded by Mullan that a 6 inch water main be extended southerly on 35th Street a distance of 175 feet and that a fire hydrant be placed at the end of same, and that City labor be used as much as possible for the work. The motion was carried and so ordered.

The Recorder announced that this was the time set for the hearing on the improvement of 33rd, 34th, and 35th Streets. The Mayor called for protests; there were no protests or objections. It was moved by Norbeck and seconded by Mullan that the Attorney be directed to prepare the necessary ordinance for the improvement of 33rd, 34th, and 35th Streets. The motion was carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Mullan that a new contract with National Stripper be authorized on substantially the same conditions as the last contract and that the acting Manager be authorized to go over the streets to determine where changes shall be made. The motion carried and was so ordered.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Mullan that Irvin Stevens be allowed \$10.00 per month for the use of his personal car while on duty. The motion was carried and so ordered.

SPECIAL MEETING OF AUGUST 16, 1950

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

A special meeting of the Council was held on the sixteenth day of August, 1950, for the purpose of considering Ordinance 542 and such other matters as were necessary to come before the Council at this time.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Taylor, Mullan, Norbeck, and Frady; Attorney Kirkpatrick. Absent: Recorder Martin.

Ordinance Number 542 was taken up and read for its first reading and was read in full.

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Norbeck that Ordinance 542 be passed to its second reading and that the rules be suspended and that the Ordinance be read by title only for its second reading at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 542, AN ORDINANCE providing for the grading and surfacing with gravel, portions of 33rd, 34th, and 35th Streets in Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon; directing the City Manager to give notice inviting proposals for the grading and graveling of said streets, by publication of the said notice in the Daily Journal of Commerce at least once; and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read by title only for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Sperr, Taylor, Mullan, Norbeck, and Frady. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 542 passed unanimously and was so declared by the Mayor.

The matter of painting the Steelex storage building was discussed. It was moved by Frady and seconded by Taylor that Mr. Transue be engaged to paint the storage building at a cost of \$192.00. Motion carried and so ordered.

Kirkpatrick It was moved by Frady and seconded by Mullan that George Kirkpatrick be paid for grading and rocking Harvester Drive, provided the work has been completed satisfactorily. Motion carried and so ordered.
