## MEETING OF AUGUST 22, 1955

COUNCIL CHAMBER

875th MEETING

The eight hundred seventy-fifth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-second day of August, 1955

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Shook and Klein; Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman Clay.

The Mayor declared that a quorum was present.

The minutes of the eight hundred seventy-fourth regular meeting of the Council, held on the eighth day of August, 1955, were approved as written.

Ordinance Number 620, AN ORDINANCE declaring the assessment for the improvement of 30th Street by the construction of curbs, sidewalks and driveways along both sides thereof, where none existed and where they did exist but did not conform to city standards as to grade, alignment or quality, from its intersection with Washington Street southerly to its southerly terminus, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read in full for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Mullan, Shook and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 620 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Manager Burdick reported the present status of the Leo Fontana dog case. Mr. Fontana has signed a statement stating that he is operating a dog kennel. Mr. Burdick stated that dogs running at large are causing much unhappiness throughout the City and laid before the Council a copy of Ordinance Number 220 and suggested that copies of the same be sent to every water user in the City and that following this notice, that the Ordinance be enforced. The Council agreed that Mr. Burdick's suggestion be carried out.

Manager Burdick stated that the Traffic Committee had met and that they recommended certain changes in parking regulations.

It was moved by Shook and seconded by Klein that the following resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 31955

WHEREAS by virtue of Ordinance Number 530 of the City of Milwaukie

the Council is authorized to make changes in traffic regulations by resolution to become effective when proper markers have been installed.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that parking of vehicles be prohibited at all times along the northerly side of Lake Road between 21st Street and Main St.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that parking of vehicles be prohibited at all times along the west and north sides of Harrison Street between 23rd Street and 21st Street.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all vehicles shall park parallel with the curb along the south side of Monroe Street between Main and 21st Streets.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no vehicle be permitted to travel in an easterly direction upon Scott Street from McLoughlin Blvd. to Main Street.

The Traffic Committee also recommended that a directional traffic sign with the words " TO CITY CENTER" be placed at the intersection of Harrison Street at McLoughlin Blvd. The Council approved the placing of the sign.

Ordinance Number 621 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Shook and seconded by Klein that Ordinance Number 621 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Burdick reported that he had made investigation of the cost of meter installations and recommended that Ordinance No. 479 be amended to bring the charge made for meter installations up to the present costs. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Shook that Ordinance Number 479 be amended as recommended by Manager Burdick. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 622 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Shook that Ordinance Number 622 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Burdick read a letter from the North Clackamas County Chamber of Commerce in which they recommended that the name of "Kellogg Park" be changed to "Milwaukie Industrial Park". They pointed out that the "Milwaukie" in the name would identify the location of the land. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Shook that the following resolution be adopted

RESOLUTION NUMBER 4-1955

BE IT RESOLVED that the name of that area lying within the northerly part of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and comprising a part of the Wm. Meek and wife D.L.C. which area has heretofore been commonly known and described as "Kellogg Park" be and the same is hereby changed from "Kellogg Park" to "Milwaukie Industrial Park"

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that notice and copies of this Resolution be furnished to the County Surveyor of Clackamas County, Oregon and other State and County officials to the end that any public record, and particularly that record of the dedication of streets within said area may be altered so as to conform to the change of name affected by this resolution.

Attorney Sheldahl reported that he had talked with Mr. Wm. B. Adams on the telephone and that he (Sheldahl) had gotten the impression that Mr. Adams was willing to compromise on the matter of selling to the city a strip of his land which would be necessary to extend Main Street to the north. Mr. Irwin Adams was present and stated that he and his brother wanted only a fair price for their property. Mr. Adams later stated that he felt that \$9,000.00 would be a fair price. Mr. Wm. Adams, being away from the City, was not available at this time. Attorney Sheldahl stated that he would contact Mr. Wm. Adams as soon as he returned to the city and if a satisfactory settlement can be made in time to call off the pending Special Election, he will notify the Mayor, in order that he (Mayor) may call a special meeting of the Council.

Attorney Sheldahl recommended that the City purchase "Oregon Laws, Revised Statutes" The Council agreed that Mr. Sheldahl or Manager Burdick purchase same, second hand if possible.

It was moved by Shook and seconded by Klein that the following bill be approved and that a warrant be drawn for the payment of same.

M. L. Treaster, for painting the flag pole \$20.00

Motion carried and so ordered.

On motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.

## SPECIAL MEETING OF AUGUST 31, 1955

## COUNCIL CHAMBER
