

## MEETING OF AUGUST 23, 1954

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

851st MEETING

The eight hundred fifty-first regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-third day of August, 1954.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan, Councilmen Shook, Clay, Klein and Wright; Attorney Kirkpatrick and Recorder Martin. Absent: Manager Sperr.

The minutes of the eight hundred fiftieth regular meeting of the Council, held on the ninth day of August, 1954, were approved as written.

Mayor Mullan reported that Mr. Newell; of the Ardenwald Stages Inc. had contacted him and had requested that he be allowed a loading zone for his busses in downtown Milwaukee. Mr. Mullan stated that Mr. Newell intended that the busses would stand for thirty minutes before starting on their return trip. It was moved by Shook and seconded by Wright that a revokable permit, with no fee, be granted to Ardenwald Stages Inc. for a loading zone at the north side of Jefferson Street at its intersection with the east side of Main Street. Motion carried and so ordered..

Acting Manager Mullan reported that Dan Harmon wished to move the two story dwelling now on his property at Washington St. and McLoughlin Blvd. and that he wanted to place it temporarily on property across Washington Street from its present location in order to cut down its height for moving to a permanent location. It was not reported if or not the entire second story was to be taken off. It was moved by Wright and seconded by Shook that a temporary permit, to place a dwelling on property adjacent to Mac's Pit at Washington Street during the time said building is being altered in height, be granted to Dan Harmon and that said permit specify a time limit of not to exceed ninety days from the time the building is placed on the property and that it also specify that a penalty of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars per day shall be paid to the City for each day the building remains thereon after the ninety days have elapsed. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Wright and seconded by Clay that a call for bids, to be opened at the regular meeting of the Council on September 13, for a heating system for the City Hall, be published one time in the Milwaukee Review. Motion carried and so ordered.

Acting Manager Mullan read a letter from Public Housing Administration, (in answer to the City's letter of July 14, 1954) which stated that all dwellings in Kellogg Park must be removed from the property before any disposition of the property would be made.

It was moved by Wright and seconded by Shook that the following bill be approved and that a warrant be drawn for the payment of same

It was moved by Wright and seconded by Shook that acting Manager Mullan be authorized to purchase a clock for the Council Chamber. Motion carried and so ordered.
