

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AUG. 11TH 1930.

The three hundred forty-first regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 11th day of August, 1930. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Sanders, Shindler, Earl, Dell and Dean, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred fortieth regular meeting of the Council held on the 14th. day of July, 1930, were read and approved as read.

Councilman Dell stated that the Minthorn Community Church would like to have all cans gathered by the Street Supt. at the next time he collects the garbage, dumped into the hole on its property. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Street Supt. was instructed to dump all cans gathered at the next regular time for gathering garbage, into the hole on the property belonging to the Minthorn Community Church.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Street Supt. was instructed to have eave troughs put on the city hall as requested by the School Board. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council contributed \$40.00 toward sending the C. C. Mullan to the Firemen's School at Corvallis, Oregon. Mr. Elliott advised the Council that the Railroad crossing signs would cost \$2.50 each. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Street Supt. to buy a sufficient number of Railroad crossing signs to comply with the order of the Public Service Commission.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Water Supt. was authorized to sell Mayor Miller the second hand 1 inch pipe that he could not use for 4 cents per foot. Upon motion duly made and carried, S. S. Fields was appointed Register to register all the voters in Milwaukie, Oregon, for city elections, and to be paid ten cents each for each voter registered. Upon motion duly made and carried, the card system of registration of voters was adopted.

Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that Burglary Insurance in the amount of \$1000.00 be secured for the protection of the City Treasurer. The Marshal and Street Supt. advised the Council that logs belonging to the Chas. R. McCormick Lumber Co. which had been dumped into the river had broken the end off the outlet of the sewer and had done damage in the amount of \$200.00. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to send the Chas. R. McCormick Lumber Company a bill for \$200.00 for damages to sewer.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the proposals for the straightening of Harrison Street at 23rd. Street, were opened and read, which proposals were as follows:

None of the proposals being satisfactory, upon motion duly made and carried, all of the proposals were rejected, and the Recorder was instructed to re-advertise for proposals for the improvement, the proposals to be opened on the 25th. day of August, 1930.
