

MEETING OF AUGUST 11, 1941

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

539th. COUNCIL

The five hundred thirty-ninth regular meeting of the Council was held on the eleventh day of August 1941.

Present: Mayor Roberts; Councilmen Newman, Makin, Walden, and Sperr; Water Superintendent Bevington, Fire Chief Lewellyn, Marshal Rigdon, Officer Burbank, Attorney Adams, and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman Kemmerer.

The minutes of the five hundred thirty-eighth regular meeting of the Council held on the twenty-eighth day of July 1941 were read and approved as read.

The Mayor reported that Milwaukie had collected 480 pounds of aluminum for National Defence.

A communication was read from the Red Cross Headquarters with regard to emergency housing for evacuees. The matter was referred to the City Hall and Parks committee.

A communication from the Southern Pacific Co. with regard to the trestle over Lake Road was read. The Recorder was requested to notify the Southern Pacific Co. of the date of the next regular meeting of the Council.

A communication from Howard Cooper Corporation referring to their bill for gear and labor for the Fire truck, was read and referred to Mr. Adams.

Ordinance Number 413, entitled "AN ORDINANCE to adopt by reference certain State traffic law provisions relating to vehicular traffic and repealing all Ordinances in conflict therewith" was taken up for the third time and read by title only with consent of all members of the Council and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Newman, Makin, Walden, Sperr. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 413 passed the Council.

Ordinance Number 414, entitled "AN ORDINANCE regulating the speed of vehicles within Milwaukie by enacting the speed restrictions of Chapter 458, Oregon Laws, 1941 and repealing all Ordinances in conflict therewith" was taken up for the first time and read. Ordinance Number 414 was read for the second and third times by title only with the consent of all members of the Council and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Newman, Makin, Walden, Sperr. Nays: None. Ordinance number 414 passed the Council.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Auditor's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

A request for a building permit for C.L. Sturtevant was tabled until the next meeting of the Council.

Mr. W.H. Lettemeier requested that the street grade be established for 30th street.

A committee from the Library Board appeared before the Council and reported that Milwaukie Library ranked second in the County in service rating. The committee requested that the City take over the responsibility and expense of operation of the Library. The Mayor suggested that the committee call on the School Boards and ask that they contribute a part of the Library expenses as the Library is a community institution and renders an important service to the schools.

Mr. Sperr reported that the manager of Safeway Stores had agreed to pave Main street in front of their store.

The Mayor reported that Mr. Praggastis had agreed to pave Main street in front of his property.

Mr. Harry Dean reported that parking along Neff's Grocery was littered with packing boxes etc. Mr. Walden was appointed to see that the parking was cleared.

The Recorder was directed to write a letter to Mr. H.H. Moyer requesting him to clean up the parking along his property at Main and Jefferson streets.

It was moved by Newman and seconded by Sperr that Mr. Peach be permitted to paint an eight foot strip of the curb at his store entrance on Jackson street, to be used as a loading zone. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Mayor set September 15, 1941 as the date for the Budget meeting.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Walden that the City purchase a fire hydrant to replace a broken one at 34th and King streets. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Newman that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrents for the payment of same.

The five hundred fortieth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-fifth day of August 1941.

It was moved by Makin and seconded by Sperr that Mr. C.L. Sturtevant be granted a building permit. Motion carried and so ordered.
