RESOLUTION AND NOTICE FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF DE WITT STREET IN THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON.

WHEREAS, pursuant to an order of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, heretofore made, the City Engineer has filed his report, and filed in the Office of the Recorder of said Town of Milwaukie plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of De Witt Street according to the petition heretofore filed, together with an estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof,

AND WHEREAS, said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory to the Council of The Town of Milwaukie:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the said plans, specifications and estimates be and the same are hereby adopted and approved, AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the purpose and intention of the Town of Milwaukie by its Town Council to make said improvements, being described as follows, to-wit:

That the said street shall be improved by grading the street to the established grade; by constructing wooden curbs and wooden sidewalks, said sidewalks to be four (4) feet wide and 18 inches from property line and to be laid on the East side of the street only; said street to be graded 30 feet wide from curb to curb, leaving a nine foot parking; by constructing wooden cross walks where needed, inlets, drains, gutters etc., and other incidentals to a proper improvement, as provided by the plans and specifications heretofore filed with the Recorder of Milwaukie and approved by this resolution.

The Town Recorder is hereby directed to cause this resolution and notice to be posted as required by the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon.

Upon motion duly made and carried Ordinance No. 90 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell and Albee; Nays, none. Ordinance No. 90 passed the first reading. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 90 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell and Albee. Nays none. Ordinance No. 90 passed the second reading. Upon motion of Councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 90 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 90 passed the third and final reading.

The one hundred thirty-seventh (137) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present: Mayor Elmer, Councilmen, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell and Albee, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed.

The Minutes of the one hundred thirty-sixth (136) regular meeting held on the 8th day of July, 1913, and also the minutes of the call meeting of the regular one hundred thirty-sixth (136) meeting held on the 28th day of July, 1913, were read and approved as read. The following bills were read and allowed, and upon motion of councilman King seconded by councilman Davis and carried the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:

Mayor Elmer was compelled to be absent for the remainder of the meeting on the account of illness in his family, whereupon councilman Mitchell presided at the meeting during his absence. The communication from Montague-O'Reilly Company asking the council for permission to sublet the excavation, the concrete curbs, and concrete sidewalks on Front Street to W. H. Counsell was read and upon motion of councilman King seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the Montague-O'Reilly Company was granted permission to sublet the excavation, concrete curbs and concrete sidewalks to W. H. Counsell, as requested in their communication.

A communication from the P. R. L. & P. Co. requesting permission to construct a concrete retaining wall along their car barn on Front Street was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the P. R. L. & P. Co. was granted permission to construct a concrete retaining wall along their car barn on Front Street, said wall not to be more than 200 feet in length nor project in the street more than 9 inches at the bottom, nor 6 inches at the top.

The matter of the acceptance of the improvement of Foster Road was taken up for consideration and after hearing the objections to the acceptance of the same the matter was referred to the street committee.

The report of R. F. Albee on the street signs was read and referred to the street committee. A propose contract between the P. R. L. & P. Co and the Town of Milwaukie to furnish the Town with lights was read and referred to the light committee. Upon motion duly made and carried the City Attorney was instructed to draw an ordinance requiring all persons or corporations operating trains through Milwaukie to install bell signals at all dangerous crossing within the Town of Milwaukie.

Upon motion of councilman Davis seconded by councilman King and carried, I. S. Mullan was appointed as the second viewer to assess benefits and damages on the proposed extension of Laurel Avenue.

Upon motion of councilman Albee seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, A. J. Walker was appointed as one of the viewers to assess benefits and damages on the proposed widening of Harrison Street.

Ordinance No. 91 entitled, "An ordinance to provide for the improvement of Monroe Street in Milwaukie, Oregon, from Main Street on the West to Shindler Street or Patton Avenue on the East, and declaring an emergency, was read and ordered posted.

Ordinance No. 92 entitled, "An ordinance to provide for the improvement of De Witt Street in Milwaukie, Oregon, and declaring an emergency," was read and ordered posted.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the council adjourned until Tuesday the 19th day of August, 1913.
