

The Recorder reported that the Hartford Accident & Indemnity Co. had notified him of its intention to cancel the bond of the City Treasurer for the reason that the City Depository (First State Bank of Milwaukie) refused to post collateral covering the city's deposits with it. It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Mourer that the Treasurer's bond be increased to \$5,000 and that the Recorder secure such a bond from another bonding company upon the effective date of the cancellation of the present bond. Motion carried and so ordered.

A. C. McMicken, official of the Portland General Electric Co., presented a revised form of proposed Street Lighting Contract and asked that the Council consider it. The proposed contract was read. It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Rivers that the proposed contract as read by the Recorder be accepted and that the Mayor and Recorder be authorized to execute the same on behalf of the city. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Rivers that the Recorder be directed to do all things necessary in order to place upon the ballot at the next city election a Charter Amendment doing away with the office of Marshal and empowering the Council to appoint all police officers. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder brought up the question of whether the Council desired to take from the table the question of the issuance of \$15,000 bonds as authorized by the Street Bond amendment adopted by the voters on May 17, 1940. It was decided to let the matter rest until ~~next~~ word had been received from WPA on the Water Reservoir Project.

The meeting adjourned.

MEETING OF AUGUST 12, 1940

The five hundred eighteenth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 12th day of August, 1940.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts. Present: Mayor Roberts, Councilmen Gillem, Kirkpatrick, Mourer, and Rudder; Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Rigdon, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the five hundred sixteenth and five hundred seventeenth regular meetings of the Council, held the 8th and 23rd days of July, 1940, were each read and were each approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

Thomas Whiting requested that the city award the city gasoline contract for the year commencing September 1, 1940, to the Union Oil Company of California. It was moved by Mourer and seconded by Rudder that the Union Oil Company of California be awarded the city gasoline contract for the year commencing September 1, 1940, and that the Mayor and Recorder be authorized to execute the contract on behalf of the city. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Rudder that the Recorder prepare and post the necessary ordinance and documents providing for the people of Milwaukie to vote at the next general election on the proposal that the city

provide the rightaway for the extension of Sellwood Street between Twenty-seventh and Thirtieth Streets. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Kirkpatrick and seconded by Mourer that the city employ a police officer on a monthly basis to serve one day a week at a salary of \$25 per month, the officer to receive additional compensation for extra work. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rivers and seconded by Gillem that the following bills be approved and that the Recorder be authorized to issue warrants covering payment of the same:
